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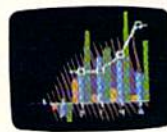
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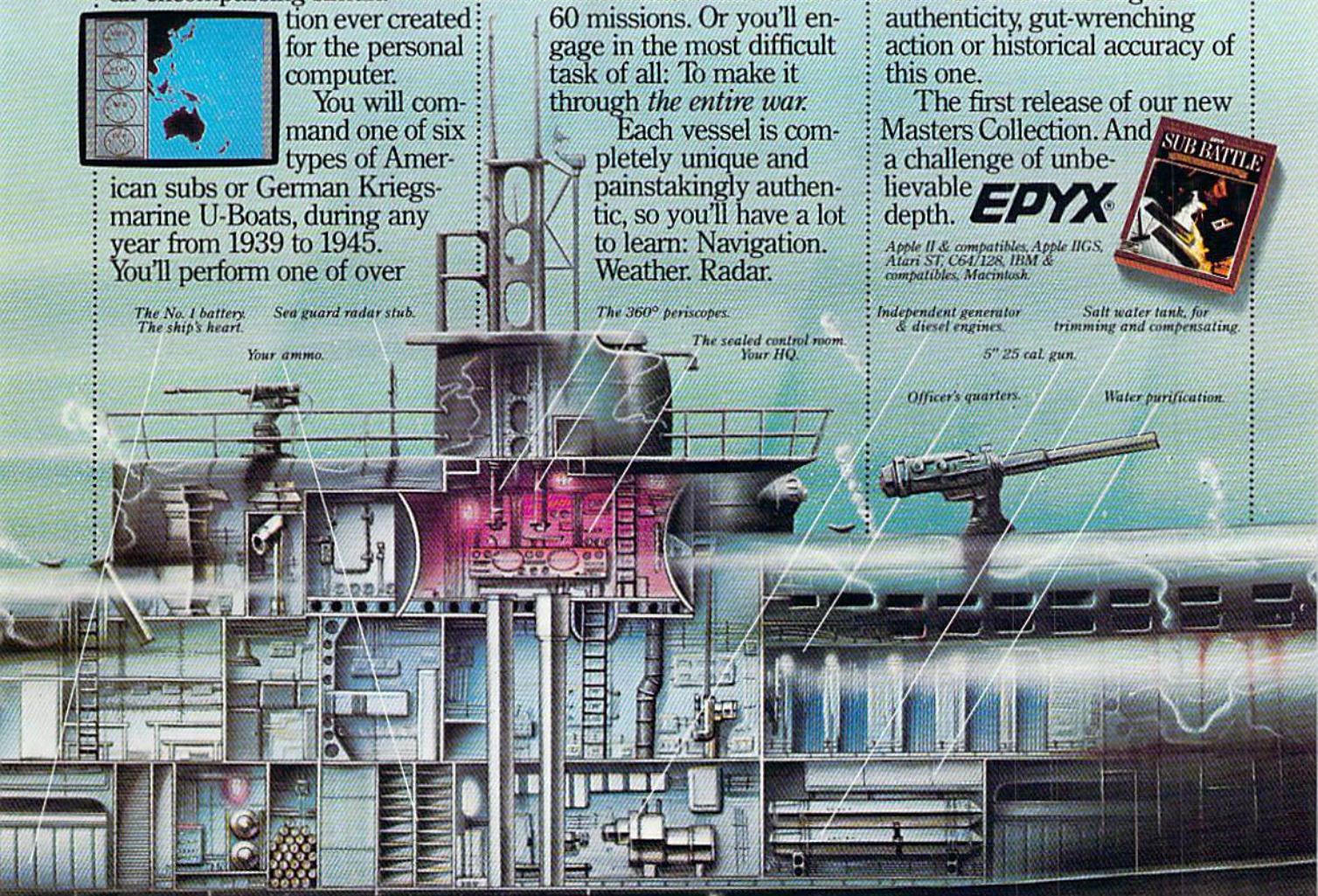
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RUNNING RUMINATIONS

This month, RUN investigates why simulations are the next best thing to being there.

SIMULATIONS: THE REAL THING

At a recent meeting of the Software Publishers Association, one representative of a major software company boldly announced that there is no such thing as consumer software. He added, "It's now more appropriately called, 'electronic interactive media.'"

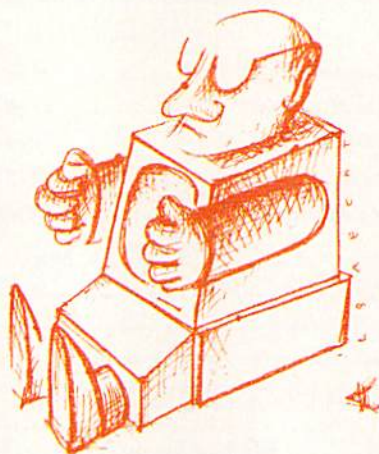
Whether you find that description pretentious or not, software developers are presenting users with an interactive experience on the computer screen. Games are more sophisticated, require more user involvement and feature spectacular visuals. The evolutionary time line places us beyond arcade games, strategy games, adventure games, role-playing games, dungeon-and-dragon-type games and fantasy games. Like it or not, we are now at the point where simulations software is the dominant games genre. It remains the fastest-growing category of software development over the past year.

I realize that not everyone is a big fan of simulations. I'll admit that there was a time when I felt that the world needed another flight simulator about as much as the American auto industry needed more foreign competition.

But simulations have improved greatly since then, with better sound, better graphics and more entertainment value. According to profiles of our readership over the years, interest in games has never waned. Behind home productivity, it ranks a strong second.

With the advent of some super-sophisticated and exciting programs—in the areas of flight, naval and sports simulations—that interest is as strong as ever. Realistic simulations put you right in the midst of the action. When you're not in the cockpit trying to follow Chuck Yeager around the sky, you can be behind the controls of a submarine or battleship trying to outmaneuver your opponents. Or, if it's on the ballfield where you really shine, then there's probably a sports simulation for you.

Beginning on page 38, *RUN* takes a look at software that simulates sports, naval and flight scenarios. So whether



you're more comfortable in cleats or sneakers, a flak jacket or a warm-up jacket, a helmet or a batting cap, you can set the scene for hours of simulation excitement.

INVESTMENTS, BACKUPS AND MOUSE USE

Playing the stock market is not a matter of fun and games. You need all the help you can get—especially in light of the recent market collapse. That's why a computer is a must.

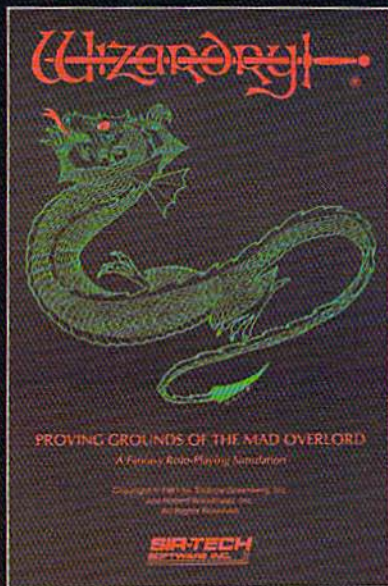

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MAGIC

Learn how to find Data statement errors in listings you typed in; discover some 1581 revelations; and make your 64's screen positively "glow."

\$469 FINDING DATA STATEMENT ERRORS

Everyone, including myself, makes mistakes typing in Data statements from magazine listings, especially if a checksum is not used. Usually you'll get an Error in Data message or Illegal Quantity Error in Line XX.

Here is an outline of a method for finding incorrectly typed or missing numbers, missing commas and periods mistyped for commas. Suppose, for example, you run the program you've spent so much time typing in and get an Illegal Quantity Error in line XX. Line XX is that line containing the command READ D, and the line might appear as follows:

```
30 FOR T=49152 TO 50035: READ D: POKE T,D: CK = CK +
  D: NEXT
```

Line 30 generates the error because READ D, the command to read the Data statements, encounters a number it can't read, such as 3036 (too many digits or a comma missing) or 3.036 (a period substituted for a comma). So the problem actually lies in one or more Data statements.

What you can do is modify line 30 by adding two lines to give you a routine that puts each number in the Data statements on the screen for you to check against the magazine listing. To line 30 (or whatever line contains the READ D command), append PRINT D directly after the READ D

command, and delete anything following it in that line. Here's an example:

```
30 FOR T=49152 TO 50035: READ D: PRINT D
```

Now enter the following two lines to complete the routine, using your own appropriate line numbers:

```
31 GET A$: IFA$="" GOTO 31
32 NEXT
```

Run the program, and the first number from the Data statements will appear on the screen. When you've verified that the number coincides with the listing, press any key to get the second data number. Continue until you find the incorrect one, press the stop key, list the line with the error, make the correction and press return to enter the line into memory.

Now run the routine again, holding down the space bar to return to the last data number you checked. Continue to verify the numbers and make any needed corrections.

Once all the corrections have been made, type in the original line 30, remove lines 31 and 32 and re-save your program. The program should then work well. You can use this trick to troubleshoot programs written for any Commodore computer.

TRICK OF THE MONTH

\$46A 64 SCREEN GLOW

A mere description won't do this program enough justice. You'll have to type it in to see how good it is. An interrupt-driven, character-color screen manipulator, 64 Screen Glow cycles the C-64's characters through the Commodore rainbow of colors, even while other programs are running. No other color-cycling routine could possibly add more eye-catching sparkle to your text displays. Its only limitation is that it won't work with other wedge-type programs occupying memory locations 49152 to 49269.

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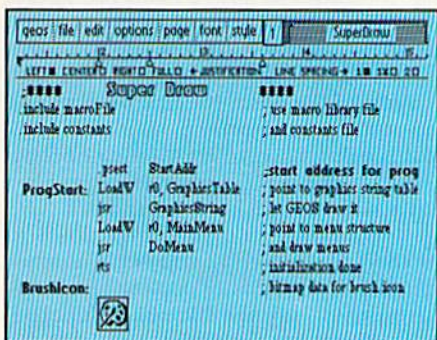

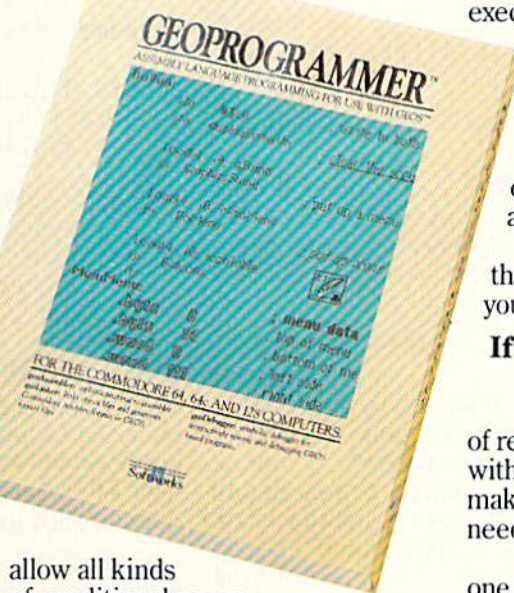

geoDebugger allows your program to be tested in memory with full symbolic disassembly, along with line assembly for patching code in memory. It also allows your code to be single-stepped or top-stepped, with sub-routines fully executed. It can stop a running program with one key, or use up to eight conditional breakpoints. When your program hits the breakpoint, it prominently displays the error in an overlay window, leaving the applications screen intact.

Animated C-64 graphics, on the other hand, usually consist of many Basic 2.0 commands and/or cryptic machine language routines.

My program, Basic Artwork 64, creates animated "op-art" with only four short lines of Basic 2.0. Your screen comes alive with a fully synchronized, changing pattern of scrolling lines, sure to draw crowds at any art show.

\$46D SHIFTED-L ENCRYPTION

When you write C-64 Basic programs containing programming secrets or some personal notes, you don't want anyone to see them. To keep prying eyes and minds away from your listings, use lots of lines containing REM (SHIFT-L) statements throughout the program. These print a Syntax error to the screen whenever someone tries to list your program. Of course, you run the danger of not knowing which lines contain those shifted L's when you want to list the program to view those notes yourself. The trick then is to run my program, Shifted-L Encryptor, which disables the shifted-L Syntax error and lets you list programs containing shifted Ls.

\$46E 64/128 MULTIPLE COPIES

Every Commodore computer offers some form of a Copy command for the disk drive. Yet Copy is much neglected, mainly because it's awkward to use, especially in its confusing Basic 2.0 syntax, which looks like:

```
OPEN 15,8,15,"CØ:NEWFILE=OLDFILE":CLOSE 15
```

Complicating the issue, the C-128's Basic 7.0's Copy command has the filenames in reversed order:

```
COPY "OLDFILE" TO "NEWFILE"
```

In order to give *RUN* readers more exposure to Copy, I've written a useful utility that works in both 64 and 128 modes and uses the Basic 2.0 Copy command to make multiple copies of any sequential, program or user disk file you want. Place the disk containing the file to be copied into the disk drive; then enter the name of the file at the first prompt and the number of copies at the second prompt.

Bear in mind that this is intended to copy only noncopy-protected files, so don't waste time trying to copy your favorite flight simulator with this trick—it won't work.

My program truncates the filename you enter down to twelve characters, and then, for each copy, appends a number from 1 up to and including the number of copies you specify at the prompt. So if you enter, say, the filename "supercalifragilistic" and specify 15 copies, the copies will have the filenames "supercalifra#1," "supercalifra#2," and so on. The screen constantly displays the number of each copy as it's

REBEL CHARGE AT CHICKAMAUGA A

You Command the Action

In This Bloody

Civil War Conflict

On the morning of September 19, 1863, Union and Confederate forces met in the woods and fields that bordered a creek named for the Cherokee word meaning "river of death." It was supposed to be another in a string of victories for the North. The Federal army under Major General Rosecrans was marching to Chattanooga, but General Bragg's Tennessee army was more than ready. For the first time in a long while, the Confederates had the Union forces outnumbered.

The two days at Chickamauga Creek were bloody and confusing. The generals made brilliant decisions and disastrous blunders. When it was over, the South had won what was probably their last major offensive thrust.

Rebel Charge at Chickamauga is the third in a series of Civil War strategy games from SSI, written by the same authors of *Battle of Antietam* and *Gettysburg: The Turning Point*. *Antietam* received much acclaim for being one of SSI's best war strategy games. *Gettysburg* was even better, and *Rebel Charge at Chickamauga* is the best to date.

In *Rebel Charge at Chickamauga*, you control either the Union or the Confederate forces. You can also play against another human opponent or let the computer play both sides. There are three levels of play: a basic game that has simplified rules, an intermediate and an advanced game. Within each level, you can change the difficulty, ammunition and reinforcements; command control requirements; set time limits; use either hidden or non-hidden units; and use icons or symbols to represent units.

Once you have set all the options, you control the individual units with the keyboard. You can move units, set

targets, build levels of fortification, transfer leaders between units and even split units into two separate forces or regroup them. You can perform reconnaissance of enemy units, change the screen from tactical to strategic views or undo a move if you think you have made a mistake.

When you've finished moving all your units and have decided who will attack, melee, bombard, and so on, the computer takes over. It calculates all the odds and resolves all conflicts. The game is divided into turns representing two hours of real time. Each turn has 12 to 14 stages, including recover/rally phases, operations phases, combat phases, and so forth. The combat phase is divided into eight stages—all computer controlled—with artillery, defensive fire, offensive fire, retreat and advance and melee stages.

There are dozens of other options, factors, settings and alternatives covered in the comprehensive 25-page manual. If you've never played a strategy simulation, then expect to spend a number of hours learning the system even in the basic game. If you're a veteran war gamer, then *Rebel Charge* has more than enough to satisfy you.

According to the package, once you have mastered the playing system, the

average game will probably take you ten to 15 hours—a conservative estimate!

One of the nicest features of *Rebel Charge* is the Save Game option—at the end of each phase, you're given the opportunity to save. The menu lets you perform all disk operations: format a blank disk, read the directory, save and delete games or load saved games.

Rebel Charge at Chickamauga may be the best strategic war simulation game yet. SSI seems to have learned from all their other games, incorporating good features and eliminating annoying ones.

There are very few things to criticize in *Rebel Charge at Chickamauga* and a great deal to recommend. It's all that a computer strategy game should be. In a relatively short amount of time, you're playing the game rather than trudging through the manual. The system of play and the computer quickly become invisible and you are immersed in the battle, wondering where the enemy is, wondering if your front line can hold out long enough for reinforcements to arrive, cheering units when they rout the foe and cursing units when they succumb to an assault.

Strategy games are not for the joystick jockies who have lightning-fast reflexes. They're games that require hours of ▶

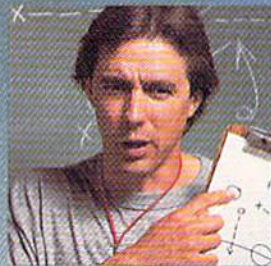

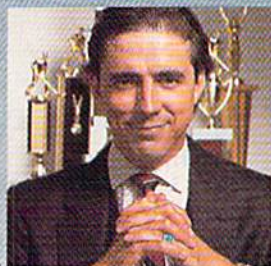

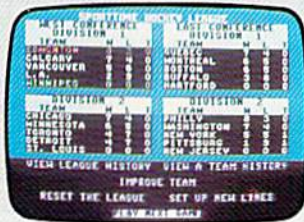

ALTERNATE REALITY: THE DUNGEON A-

Question: Stay in an Alternate Reality, or Attempt Vengeance on Earth?

Beneath every large city is a maze. In the world of everyday, mundane reality, these are service tunnels, basements and transitways; but in an Alternate Reality, beneath THE city, you'll find The Dungeon!

In this second installment of DataSoft's epic maze adventure series, you can continue with a character from Alternate Reality: The City, or start anew. Either way, your long-term goal is to make it back to Earth or track down and punish some alien kidnappers. One warning: long term means just that, because at least five additional Alternate Reality scenarios are in the works.

Your immediate concern is to avoid becoming ghoulish food! The first of four dungeon levels is a passageway and room maze packed with thieves, demons and so on. Many of the items you find are dripping with noxious curses. If some monster or disease doesn't put you under, there's always a chance you'll annoy an otherwise friendly or neutral personage, find yourself on the wrong side of a guild feud, or even get lost and perish from thirst or starvation. But, to balance its hazards, the labyrinth supplies restorative fountains, a non-lying (!) oracle, and other services, from smithing and weapons enchantment to potion making and banking.

A new character begins with attributes and equipment roughly amounting to "warm meat" status. Still, you do get to start in a well-lit area with a 3-D perspective of nearby walls and doors.

Learning the ropes, honing your skills, careful mapping and luck all impact your prospects for success. During encounters, common sense helps too.

Sometimes selecting the Transact option, rather than Attack or Run, yields valuable information, a lucrative quest or even a chance for skill-enhancing membership in a guild. Almost every action also affects your "moral alignment," which, in turn, influences relations with various dungeon personages.



What will you decide to do in The Dungeon's Potion Brewery?

Each orientation (good, neutral or evil) offers momentary advantages; so, there's no requirement that you wrap up the scenario's major quest as a "good guy." You've succeeded if you make it through The Dungeon with a character who's tougher, more skilled and better prepared for future adventuring.

Despite an excellent manual, mapping grid and other aids, getting started in a game designed to challenge developed City characters is very rough for beginners. Explicit prompts and status displays are of great help and, except for the extra disk flipping necessitated by reliance on a single drive, mechanics remain unobtrusive. Featuring effective graphics, good sound and a spectacular introduction, The Dungeon quickly draws you into one of adventure gaming's more elaborate, most entertaining alternate realities. Try Your Computer Tongue at a New Language

If you've been thinking about experimenting with something besides Basic and machine language on your Com-

modore computer, perhaps you should try C. Spinnaker's Power C, in its Better Working series, provides a package that comes with disks, happily unprotected, for both the C-64 and C-128.

The software is easy to use. You first load a special program—a shell—that provides you with a mini operating system tailored to the C development environment.

As with most micro-based language compilers, program development can be tedious. In order to compile a program, you first load the compiler, which prompts you to insert the work disk with the program source on it. Next, you're told to insert the system disk again for the translation phase. Then, you're prompted for the work disk again so the object file can be created.

You're not through yet, however! In order to run the program, you must go through a link phase so that C library functions can be combined with your object files to create an executable program module. This requires you to load the linker from the system disk, then load your program's object files from the work disk, and finally load the library routines from the library disk!

Fortunately, you can minimize the swapping by backing up the system disk and using the backup as a combination system/work disk. If you're lucky enough to have two disk drives, you might not have to swap disks at all.

For C-128 owners, the package is smart enough to let you use some of the extra available memory as a pair of small RAM disks. You can copy your program, along with any of the standard C library source files that it needs, into RAM and edit or compile from there. This minimizes swapping and allows for instantaneous file access for all 128 users with single disk drives. Of course, if you use this feature you must remember to copy all your work to a real floppy before turning the system off, because the RAM disks disappear when the electrons stop flowing.

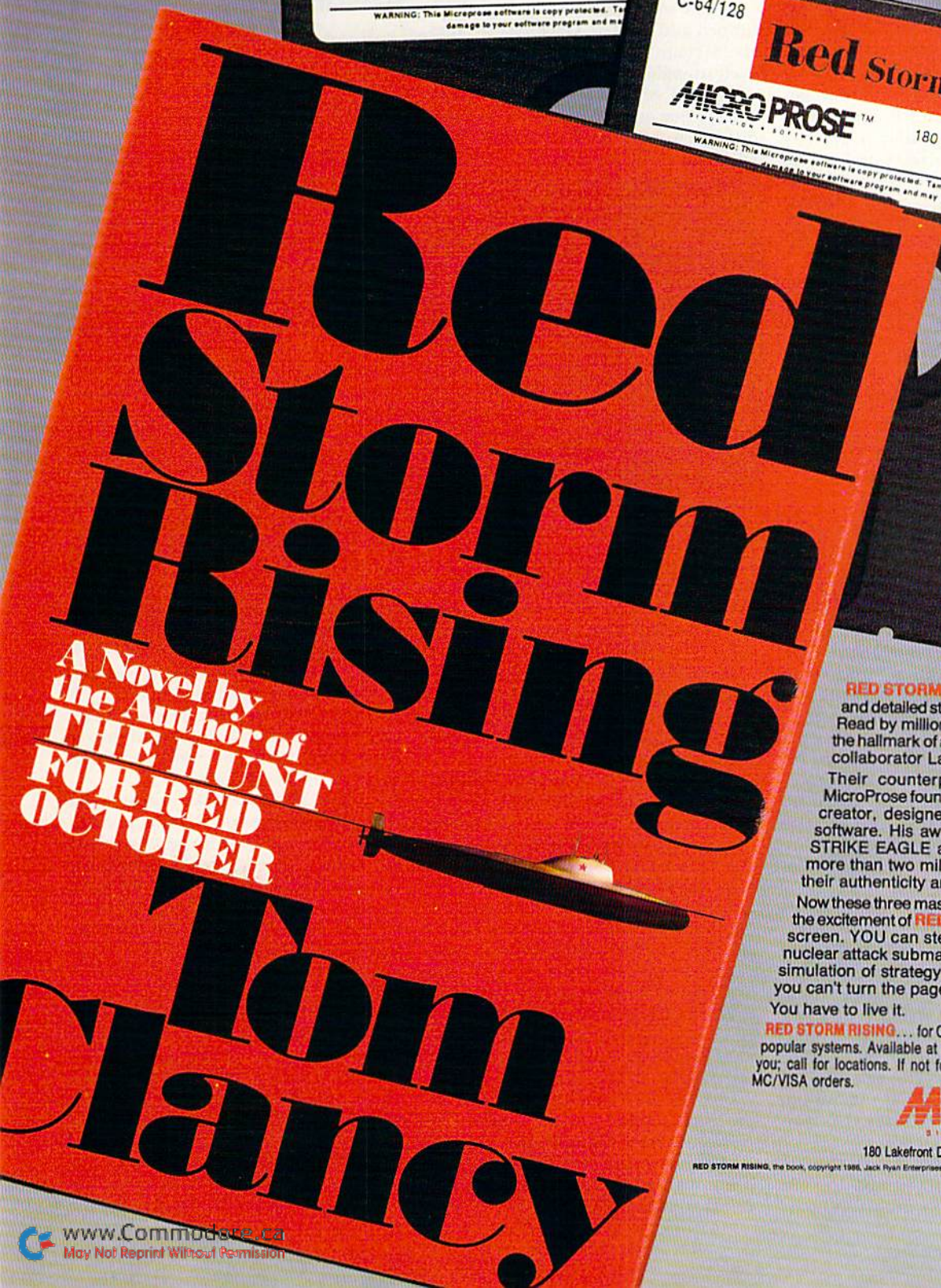
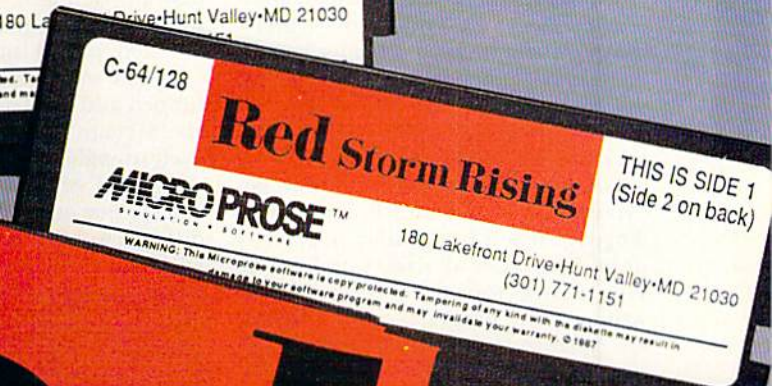
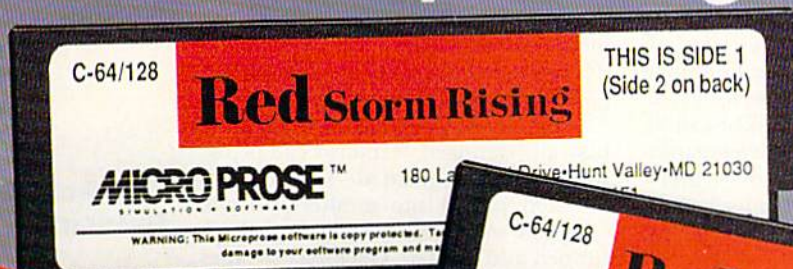
Power C contains a full screen editor for source-code creation and maintenance. In fact, there are actually two editors: the longer version checks the source for language syntax errors.

Since the language is designed to be portable, an important part of any C development environment is the runtime library, which provides functions for input/output, string handling and math. Power C has very good runtime support, including a special function that lets you call machine language subroutines from within your C programs.

The manual is well written, despite the ▶

fact that it's cheaply printed on thin paper. It's logically organized, and obvious pains have been taken to describe not only which features of the language aren't implemented (bit fields, for example), but also non-evident ways of writing efficient programs. The documentation is by no means a C tutorial; there isn't a complete sample program anywhere in the manual, although there are a few on the system disk. If you want to learn C, the recommended reading list in the back of the manual is excellent.

Power C is an affordable way to get exposure to a powerful programming language that is fast gaining popularity on computers of all sizes. Check it out. Who knows? You may never go back to writing Basic programs again. (Spinner Software Corp., One Kendall Square, Cambridge, MA 02139. C-64, C-128/\$39.95.)

A Graphics Program

With a Flavor

From Abroad

It does seem that just about everything that can be done in a drawing program for the C-64 has been done. So why review another one? In this case, it's a good package with a foreign flair to it: The Advanced OCP Art Studio is a product of British ingenuity.

The Art Studio has followed in the footsteps of icon-driven programs. It's relatively easy to use, accommodates keyboard, joystick, mouse or KoalaPad, fully supports both disk and cassette (which is still in use, mostly outside the U.S.), and operates in Multicolour (English spelling!) mode.

For a patient artist, Art Studio offers all the tools necessary to create some pretty sophisticated images. But, I really think you have to try a program like this in order to evaluate its ease of operation. Personally, I found it no more difficult than my favorite programs, and more user-friendly than many of those I've reviewed. The selection of "pens and brushes," along with an impressive variety of patterns, lets you readily add subtle touches.

The Advanced OCP Art Studio includes the ability to add text to your pictures. It comes with a futuristic-look-

ing computer font. You can also copy the standard CBM character set into memory for use in your pictures, although it tends to look somewhat ragged, particularly when enlarged.

Other features of the program are basically standard. Windows can be defined and manipulated. They can be inverted, pasted into another position, enlarged, squashed, reduced, stretched, flipped and rotated. Geometric shapes are a snap—lines, circles, boxes and even triangles are simple to create.

Because of the way the computer stores color information, it's sometimes difficult to keep all the colors the way you want them in a graphics program.

While Art Studio can't change the way the computer works, it does let you select color priority and exclusion lists. That's helpful when you want to draw behind existing images.

A variety of printers are supported, with the program coming initially set up for the MPS-801. The package allows for sideways printing of full-screen images.

The manual is complete without being overbearing. The disk is protected in a very simple way: It requires that you input a particular word from the documentation before it can function. Since computer hackers are notorious for losing or never obtaining the documentation, it seems a reasonable way to offer some protection without knocking the head in your disk drive out of alignment.

While the manual is in English, a glossary translates key words into German and French. That's a nice touch for an international program.

If you're in the market for a graphics program or like to collect them, The Advanced OCP Art Studio receives my endorsement. The only reason I rated it less than excellent is because it joins so many already popular and versatile

A Reading Teacher's

Testing Aid

For All the Grades

Most English teachers have some interesting book report stories. A child who turned in a summary of an assigned biography of Franklin Roosevelt furnished my own personal favorite. What book the student read, if any, was brought into question by his describing *Teddy* Roosevelt, not Franklin, as being confined to a wheelchair throughout his life.

Such odd compositions may be a thing of the past. The Accelerated Reader offers elementary and secondary schools the use of computers as an alternative to traditional book reports.

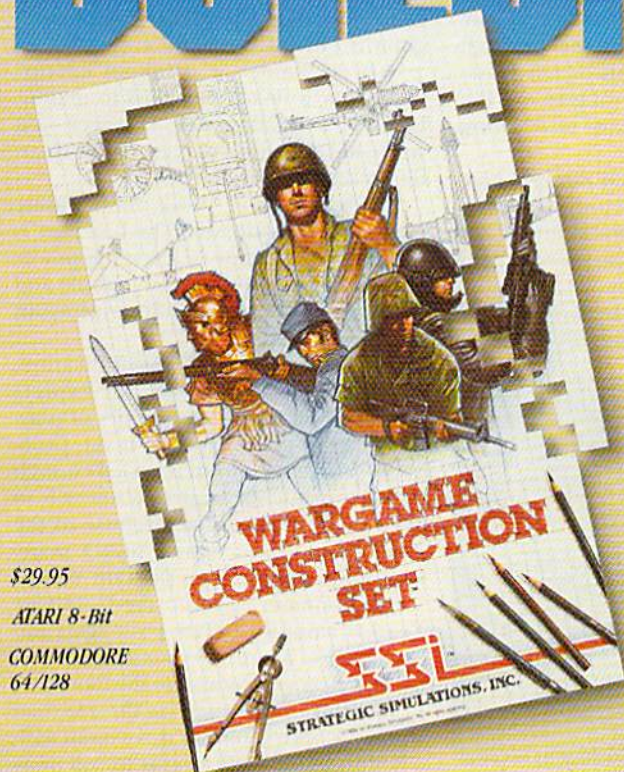
The software package contains six disks. Two are a record-keeping program disk and its backup. The other four disks contain tests for 150 books. Each book falls under one of three categories: the Basic Reading Series (100 books with reading levels ranging from 3.1 through 8.1), Children's Classics (25 books with reading levels of 7.2 through 10.4) and the Bridge to Adult Reading (25 books with reading levels of 7.3 through 12.3). The Basic Reading Series asks ten multiple-choice questions on each work, while the other two categories have 20 questions.

Each of the 150 books is assigned a maximum number of "reading points," which are calculated by adding ten to the book's reading level, multiplying the sum by the number of words in the text and dividing that product by 100,000. After applying this formula, *Bambi*, for example, receives a maximum reading point total of 7, while *Anna Karenina* receives 73.

If a student scores at least 60% on a ten-question exam or 70% on a twenty-question test, he or she earns actual reading points based on the book's maximum point total multiplied by the percentage of correct answers. However, the pupil doesn't receive any points if the exam's minimum percentage is not reached. Also, a student who fails is not allowed a retest on that book unless the

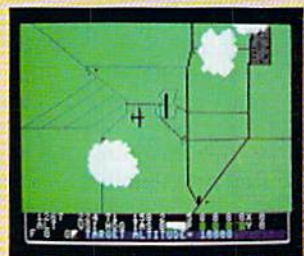

teacher first modifies the Program Disk.

To use The Accelerated Reader, an educator assigns a unique computer password to each class member. The students then read unabridged versions of titles chosen from the program's reading list.

After completing a book, a child takes the computer test. The program disk records the results and updates the pupil's records.

The Accelerated Reader can generate printed reports for individual students and for a class as a whole. It can also produce additional tests for books that aren't on its reading list. The documentation explains in great detail how to estimate any text's reading level and word total. The number of maximum reading points can be calculated with this data.

The instruction manual recommends the use of material rewards, perhaps valued at five or ten cents per actual reading point, to motivate students' efforts. It suggests that schools establish a "store" where earned reading points are traded for popular merchandise.

The software does have some potential problems. One involves the test questions. They occasionally ask about some of the finer details of a story. As a result, the more time that passes after a book has been read, the more likely it is that some details will be forgotten and fewer actual reading points will be earned. Because of this, students should have ample access to the program.

On the other hand, pupils shouldn't have unlimited access to The Accelerated Reader. This could result in cheating, which seems to be a major concern of the software's developers. To combat it, they instituted the password system and programmed a change in the order of possible responses each time a question is asked.

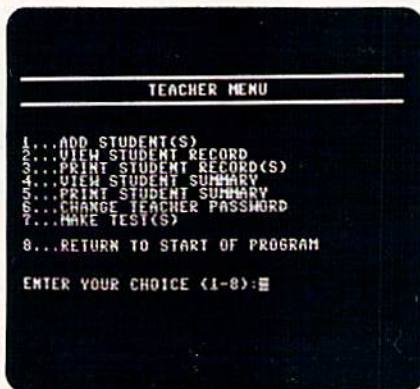
But children will still be tempted to cheat, especially considering the material rewards they may gain. Therefore, strict control must always be maintained over the software if answer-sharing and even disk-copying are to be prevented.

Another, more basic difficulty is the possible misuse of the program, which could actually impede the learning of literature.

The Accelerated Reader is a testing, not a teaching, program. All of its questions are literal; none are interpretative or evaluative. Students who don't get a passing score don't learn the correct responses to the questions they missed, nor even which of the questions they answered properly.

However, understanding literature is more than just memorizing facts to pass such tests. Instead, its essence is the appreciation of the human message that the author conveys in his or her work. It would be seriously wrong to use the program as the sole means of teaching literature.

But the software, if used wisely in conjunction with other techniques, does have significant educational merit. For one thing, its 150 books are all excellent additions to any reading list. Also, the program can save teachers that most valuable of educational resources—

time. And the support provided by a user-friendly operating system and clear instructions helps to make a very attractive software package.

Readup, Inc. also offers a generous warranty that encourages schools to try the program. If students are not reading more and better books within one year of purchase, the company will issue a refund. Look What They've

Done to Our

Arcade Game

While other companies strive to break new ground in entertainment software, Data East stands out from the crowd by sticking to a tried-and-true formula for enjoyable programs.

Like other Data East favorites, Express Raider is based on an arcade game. And like its predecessors, the program is entertaining and enjoyable.

Express Raider is a "shoot-em-up" that's easy to learn but hard to master. Unlike an arcade game, however, you won't have to spend a bag full of quarters trying to conquer it.

That's the good thing about home versions of arcade hits. The bad part is that some programs lack staying power because game play is usually simple and you can play forever without wiping out your bank account.

If my experience is any indication, that won't be a problem with Express Raider. After 10-12 total hours of playing time, I haven't tired of it yet, probably because the action is varied enough and the challenge is strong enough to keep my attention. The premise of the game is fresh, too—there aren't many computer games set in the Old West.

Bandits have captured the Gold City Express, along with all the passengers and valuables on board. It's your job to rescue the travelers and recapture the loot.

You start your quest at the railroad station, where you must duke it out with a bandit as the train begins to roll away from the station. Defeat him before the train pulls out, hurdle a few obstacles, and you'll find yourself perched on top of the train's very last car.

Now you have to fight your way to the front of the train. Each car offers a new foe. Some fight like you, with bare hands, but others have weapons.

Should you reach the train's locomotive, you'll recapture the loot. The scenario then changes, and you find yourself riding horseback alongside the train while bandits on board shoot at you. During this stage of the game, you have to dodge their bullets and try to pick them off one at a time with your own six-gun, which is difficult, because there's more than one bandit on each car, and they keep ducking for cover.

The joystick and fire-button control all the action in Express Raider. In the first part of the game, the stick is used much the same way as it's used in martial arts simulations. You duck, jump, lie down or walk by moving the joystick in the corresponding direction. You punch or kick by hitting the fire-button. In the second part of the game, the joystick lets you move in any of eight directions as you ride alongside the train. This helps you dodge bullets and also determines where your own bullets will land.

One thing that makes Express Raider a pleasure to play is the way the on- ▶

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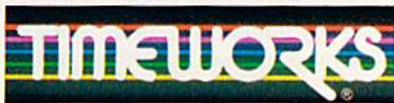
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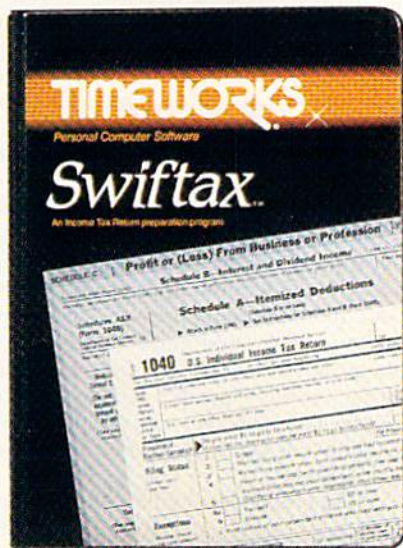

screen action responds to joystick movements. Nothing is more frustrating than playing a shoot-'em-up that responds slowly or erratically to joystick input. Happily, that isn't the case here.

The graphics and play action also make Express Raider enjoyable. While certainly not state of the art, the graphics are attractive, clear enough to let you see what's happening at all times and free of any noticeable flicker or other distractions. You get a real feeling of train movement when you're hopping from car to car in the first part of the game, and you can truly imagine yourself on the horse in the second part.

The best players will rack up record point totals while reaching the locomotive in both stages of the game. But even players who find it impossible to reach the locomotive can enjoy the challenge of trying to break their own personal point records.

The game's various options make it easy to get the practice required to set such records. There are three Play modes and four levels of difficulty in each mode. The different Play modes correspond to the number of lives you have and number of trains you must complete to save the Gold City Express. Another option lets you pick up right where you left off after you've lost all of your allotted lives.

Features such as those are typically missing from arcade games, so you might say that in some ways the home version of Express Raider is better than any arcade version could be. But for the most part, Express Raider follows Data East's tried-and-true formula, and it proves there's absolutely nothing wrong with that. (*Data East, 470 Needles Drive, San Jose, CA 95112. Finally, A Woman's

Romance Novel

On the Computer Screen

Almost all adventure games ever created have been aimed at a traditionally male-dominated market, on the assumption that women account for only a small percentage of entertainment software purchases. With that being so, Infocom's *Plundered Hearts* breaks out into new territory.

Plundered Hearts is designed by a

woman, for women. The storyline is reminiscent of a steamy romance novel set in the late 17th century. You play the part of a beautiful young English-woman who has just received a letter from Jean LaFond, governor of the island of St. Sinistra and purported friend of your father. LaFond insists that you leave London immediately and come to your father's side at St. Sinistra in the West Indies. He has fallen victim to a tropical disease, and only your presence will aid his recovery.

On the way to St. Sinistra, your ship is attacked by pirates. The pirate captain, a young outcast socialite named Nicholas Jamison, warns you that the letter and your dad's illness are tricks to lure you to the island. Jamison has an old score to settle with Lord LaFond, and offers to help free your father. You decide to trust the young pirate, and begin a long and hazardous journey to free dad from the dungeon of Jean LaFond.

Plundered Hearts is touted as interactive fiction. By typing in spoken English words, you affect the final outcome of the story. The plot can take several different directions, depending on how you react to the various puzzles and dilemmas you encounter. Infocom has one of the best parsers (the part of the program that deciphers your input) in the business, perfecting it to such an extent that you feel as though you're actually talking to the story rather than just typing.

Plundered Hearts is, however, considerably less interactive than most Infocom games, and it sports a much smaller vocabulary of words that it can understand—approximately 700—whereas most can process between 1000 to 2000 words. But what the game lacks in words, it more than makes up for in plot.

There's a lot of reading involved. While you might find that you have little or no control over many of the situations that arise during the course of play, *Plundered Hearts'* well-written prose should keep you in the thick of the plot until the very end.

Plundered Hearts is not quite at the introductory level. It's challenging enough to entice even the most seasoned adventure gamer, regardless of sex, while still rudimentary enough not to overwhelm first-time players. Of course, Infocom's legendary reputation for supplying first-rate documentation is still justified.

But this is a romance story, with all that entails, and aside from the small vocabulary and obvious clichés scattered throughout the story, *Plundered*

These Helpers

Even Do Windows!

C-More advertises itself as a "new operating system" that will "change forever the way you use your Commodore 64." It is a window- and menu-based system that provides a set of tools: a word processor, spreadsheet, database manager and scientific calculator.

C-More's windowing and multi-tasking capabilities are its outstanding features. Up to four windows, in various configurations, can be on the screen at once, and up to eight different "tasks" or programs can be assigned at one time. If you have more tasks than windows, the idle tasks wait patiently in the background until you pull them into a window and restart them.

Because the tasks can outnumber the windows, they are identified by helper names: Jill, Robert, Phil, Anthony, Lizzie, Susan, David and Mary. Notice that each helper name begins with a different letter, so you can reference them by typing a single character. In order to move to a task window, you specify the name of the helper rather than the window number or the utility in that window. This seems a little confusing at first, but turns out to be practical, because you can use the word processor with two different helpers to edit documents in two separate windows, or two parts of the same document in separate windows.

The windowing software is great. You can easily change the screen display from one to four windows in various horizontal and vertical configurations. Each window's background and character color can be different. Pop-up menus at the bottom of the screen aid the navigation between tasks, and each utility program has its own set of help menus.

Unfortunately, the utilities are somewhat of a disappointment compared to the operating environment that supports them. For example, the word processor, *Writer*, is somewhat primitive compared to other commercially avail-

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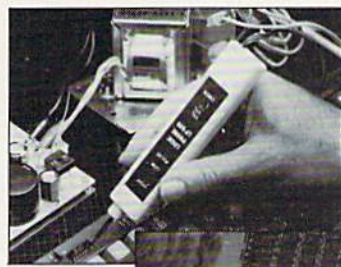

able word processors. It has the basic full screen editing features you'd expect, like word wrap, search with replace and block move or delete. But it falls short in the formatting department—you can only specify top, bottom and side margins, and whether the output should be single- or double-spaced. Moreover, the format parameters you establish are in force for the entire document, and there's no way to automatically center lines, to add page numbers, headers or footers, or to chain documents together. I tried using it to write part of this review, and was soon frustrated by the lack of features.

One of the most irritating of Writer's idiosyncrasies is that the paragraph marker is generated by the shift/up arrow keys, instead of simply pressing return as in most other word processors. To make matters worse, pressing the return key is how you get back to Command mode. I was constantly pressing return by mistake and then having to type the entry command to get back to Input mode.

The spreadsheet, Formulator, works reasonably well. It's limited to 64 rows

and eight columns—the size of a printed page. That might prove a little lean for more ambitious applications. Column width is preset at ten, so only four columns fit on the screen at one time. You can, however, split the screen into two horizontal windows and have two tasks working on the same spreadsheet simultaneously. Although Formulator is by no means sophisticated, it's certainly powerful enough for budgeting and other home applications.

Keeper, the database manager, is adequate for mailing lists, phone directories and other home uses. Database definition is done with a special Basic support program outside of C-More that can be a little difficult to learn. The Calculator program is well thought out and includes four on-screen memories and a range of built-in functions for things like computing loan payments. Filer and Copier are typical disk management and copy utilities, respectively.

Also included in C-More is a specialized utility that, at first glance, seems out of place in the program. Home Buyer can be used to explore financial issues like comparing mortgages or buy-

ing versus renting. After studying the manual, however, you'll discover that you can adapt your own Basic programs (up to 6K long) to run as tasks in the C-More environment.

C-More's documentation is very impressive, with clear descriptions of all the commands and utilities. The package also comes with a demo disk that does an excellent job of illustrating each feature.

If you're already familiar with a word processor like PaperClip or a spreadsheet like Multiplan, the limited capabilities of the C-More counterparts will probably prove somewhat disappointing. On the other hand, if you're a casual correspondent with modest database and financial planning requirements, C-More's utilities might be perfectly adequate for your needs. For under \$60, Jill, Robert and the rest of the gang will be happy to help you write, file, copy and count. And best of all, they love doing windows. 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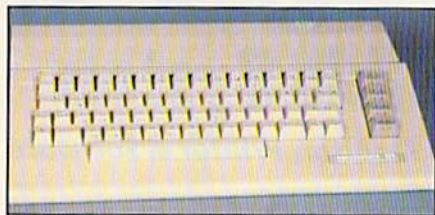
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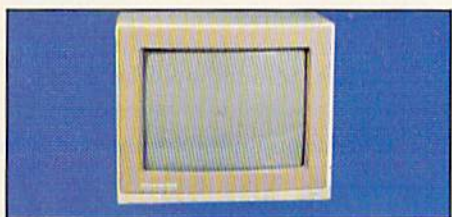


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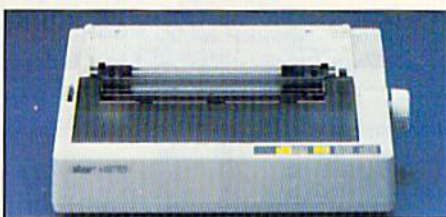
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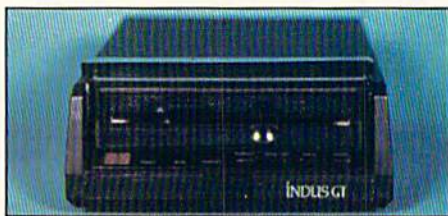
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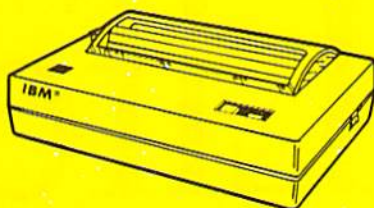
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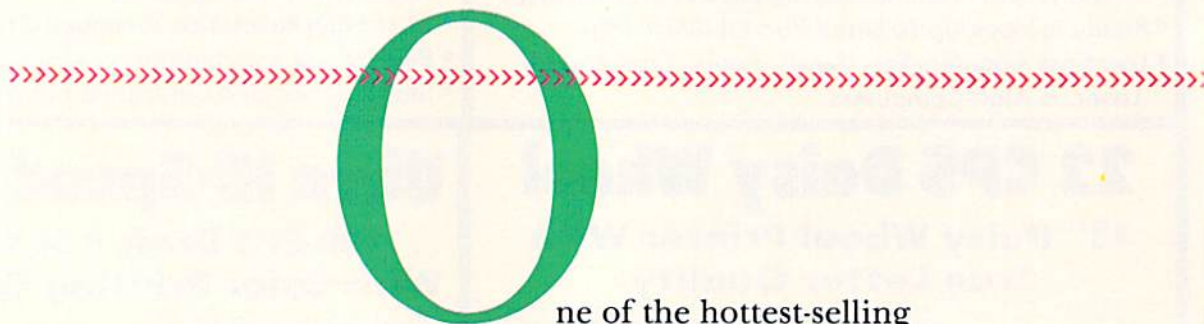


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Simulating Real-Life Action . . .



One of the hottest-selling categories of entertainment software these days is simulation software. And it's no mystery as to why. What other form of entertainment can put you in control of real-life situations? The movie *Top Gun* may be exciting to watch on the silver screen, but it can't put you in the pilot's seat and at the controls of the latest hi-tech fighter plane. The World Series *can* be exciting with the right teams, but only a baseball simulation can give you that every year. And taking a cruise on a hydrofoil is great fun, if you can find one; but if not, you can get a lot of fun out of a simulation where you're at the controls.

In this issue, *RUN* explores three of the most popular categories of simulation software for the C-64. So lace your sneakers for a run in a variety of sports, don your admiral's hat to map naval strategy, or get behind the controls of a hot jet in a flight simulation. There are some great Commodore simulation programs out there for almost anyone's taste in excitement.



...On the Playing Field...

FIVE SECONDS LEFT in the fourth period and the score is tied. Who will get the last basket? Poised on the edge of your chair, you guide your players smoothly down the court, and . . . your opponents steal the ball!

Well, it was fun, anyhow, and that's what computer simulations of sports are all about—the excitement of athletic competition when you're not athletically inclined or a blizzard is raging outside.

Whatever the sport you enjoy or would like to try, chances are you can find a computer version

for your Commodore. While some of these programs resemble one another because the same people wrote them, they tend to differ in the level of player involvement and overall sophistication. Nearly every sports simulation requires work disks for saving scores, and most of them use a joystick as the primary input device. You should spend a little more than you might wish and get the highest quality joystick you can to complement your fine shootin' arm.

This article is a survey of a number of football, baseball, basketball, golf, bowling, ice hockey and ►

soccer simulations, along with a couple of general interest games. First, to the golf course.

WORLD CLASS LEADER BOARD

I'm not a golfer, maybe because I've never worked in a financial institution or for a major brewery, so when I tell friends I spent Saturday morning "on the green," I'm referring to mowing the lawn. In fact, I've avoided golf, since I thought it was little more than a waste of time and effort unless I could earn a living at it, like Arnold Palmer.

However, my thoughts did a complete about-face after playing World Class Leader Board, a C-64 golf simulation developed by the famous duo of Bruce and Roger Carver. Marketed by Access Software, this game puts you right on the course where you have to fight trees and sand traps. Access also offers Volumes I and II of Famous Courses of the World, two disks that require the Leader Board package.

Leader Board lets you select your skill level, your clubs and the course to play. Using a joystick as your golf club, you hold down the fire-button and release it in a synchronized way to determine your backswing (power) and whether the shot will be straight, a hook or a slice. Leader Board taught me the not-so-subtle difference between a 1-wood and a putter, and how variables in my selection of club and swing affect each shot.

All the Leader Board courses are so enjoyable to play, I feel guilty being paid to review them. Do yourself a favor and get this game to learn the fun of playing golf, or, if you're already a golfer, tee off on the next rainy Saturday.

TENTH FRAME

I spent many of my Friday and Saturday nights as a teenager at the candle-pin bowling alley. Candle-pins, found exclusively in New England, are much like ten-pins, except the ball is smaller, so you can roll it faster, and the pins, thinner and taller, are more difficult to knock down.

I probably wouldn't have spent so much time at the alley if the C-64 and 10th Frame had existed at the time. This game, which simulates ten-pins and not candle-pins, is another Bruce and Roger Carver original from Access Software that translates into lots of fancy graphics and plenty of realism. You can even adjust the sound of your ball rolling down the lane and crashing into the pins.

You use a joystick to position your bowler, then press and release the fire-button in a smooth, precise manner to give the ball the amount of speed and hook needed to accurately hit the pins. Until you develop style and form, your rolls are as unpredictable as in real life.

Get 10th Frame for hours of kegling fun, but also get Leader Board to provide yourself with a break from the alley.

CHAMPIONSHIP BASEBALL

As long as I'm in an effusive mood, I'll continue with a sensational C-64 baseball simulation: Championship Baseball, from Activision.

Championship Baseball uses a vertically split

screen, with the right half occupied by large, accurate depictions of pitchers and batters. The left half contains the baseball diamond with the players positioned about the field. In Practice mode, you can use your joystick to swing at a series of pitches thrown by the computer-controlled pitcher. In Game mode, you take turns batting and fielding.

Hitting a pitch in Championship Baseball isn't easy. Then again, hitting one of Roger Clemens' fastballs isn't easy, either. Scrutinizing the pitcher's moves precisely is the only way to avoid swinging too late or too soon. When you hit the ball just right, the players in the left half of the screen scramble to field it.

When you're the pitcher, you alter your throws by making minute movements of the joystick and pressing the fire-button. I occasionally throw some strikes, but it isn't easy to do consistently unless you use all your powers of concentration.

Once the opposing team gets a hit, you must assume the role of the fielder the ball lands closest to, reacting instantly and precisely with your joystick.

Championship Baseball seems every bit as hard and every bit as rewarding as the real-life game.

PURE-STAT BASEBALL

A sports simulation roundup wouldn't be complete without mention of Software Simulations' Pure-Stat Baseball. In typical sports simulation fashion, Pure-Stat Baseball lets you play against a friend or the computer. Two unnotched disks, one a game disk, the other containing data on all the teams from the 1985 National and American Leagues accompany the package. The documentation includes a 42-page instruction manual, along with a 26-page Manager's Guide Book.

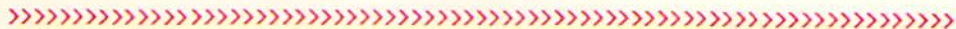
The play in Pure-Stat Baseball, as its name implies, is based on the statistical histories of the players. Your job is to draft and trade players astutely, then coach your assembled team to victory. Pure-Stat offers up to nine games per season, which translates into a lot of playing time.

To keep things interesting for long-term users, Software Simulations also sells accessory disks containing data on additional teams and stadiums. However, keeping things interesting for beginning players isn't a pressing need, because you're busy trying out stadiums, rotating pitchers and comparing the skills of batters and pitchers, fielders and base runners, plus making countless other decisions.

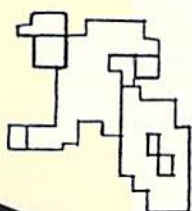
The graphics are good, the action is quick and the players' moves are convincingly realistic. A computer sports simulation couldn't be much better than Pure-Stat Baseball.

STREET SPORTS BASEBALL

In Street Sports Baseball, you're not playing with professionals, but with a group of neighborhood kids on a lot full of rocks, trashcans and tree stumps. You don't have to read the manual to start playing this game, which is more of an arcade type than a sports simulation. You just assume the role of pitcher if your team is in the field, or you become the batter if your team



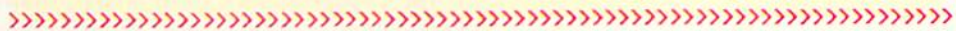
Down on the gridiron in Software Simulations' Football.

is up. You also play all the infield and outfield positions when the ball comes near.

The graphics are good, but Street Sports Baseball will probably bore adults. However, it's interesting and lively enough to keep kids, for whom it's designed, occupied for hours.

GBA CHAMPIONSHIP BASKETBALL: TWO-ON-TWO

With one of the longest titles in the software industry, GBA Championship Basketball: Two-on-Two (GBA for short) isn't your average computer basketball game. The sprites in this game actually do look like basketball players, proportionally correct as they run about the court. They also handle the ball realistically, whether dribbling, passing or shooting a jump shot.

Like most sports simulations, GBA has both practice and game modes. You can select one or two players, and every two-player game, whether you're playing against your best friend or the computer, gives each competitor a computer-controlled teammate. Any type of shot from any location on the court is tricky, especially if you're playing against the computer. You have to make synchronized joystick/fire-button moves to evade the player guarding you, while at the

same time successfully getting off your shot.

Fortunately, you can return your opponent's favor by aggressively blocking his attempted shots. All in all, GBA Basketball is a fine sports simulation.

NBA

Unlike GBA Basketball, Avalon Hill's NBA isn't just a move-the-joystick-as-fast-as-you-can game. Rather, it transforms computer basketball into a slower-paced, thinking man's sport, which doesn't mean it's boring. You control the players' moves indirectly by using the joystick to choose various options from a list.

You select the visiting and home teams from 20 real NBA teams, then specify a computer or a one- or two-player game, the number of games to be played and any lineup changes you want to make. Playing NBA basketball isn't just a matter of controlling your players' moves; you get to implement both offensive and defensive strategy by selecting a point guard, then deciding how many passes, steals, outside shots, etc., you want your players to attempt. Considerable thought is required to decide who on your team is best fitted for each task, based on their statistical ratings. Needless to say, a good working

knowledge of basketball and its related terminology is valuable when you play NBA.

PURE-STAT COLLEGE BASKETBALL

Software Simulations' Pure-Stat College Basketball is so similar to Avalon Hill's NBA that the only way I can tell them apart is to read the team rosters. Like NBA and Pure-Stat Baseball, it's a decision-by-decision game that lets you plan every move before executing it.

If you're a long-time college basketball fan, you'll like this game. If you're looking for fast-paced action, then you should seek out an alternative, such as GBA Championship Basketball: Two-on-Two.

STREET SPORTS BASKETBALL

A rather disadvantaged-looking youngster on the cover of Epyx's Street Sports Basketball sums up what this game is all about—low-budget, neighborhood competition. Forget about Larry Bird and Magic Johnson here; you'll find kids with names like Radar, Vic and Melissa.

As you'd expect with any C-64 Epyx game released in 1987, Street Sports Basketball features well-defined graphics. You control just one player on your team at a time, holding down the fire-button to make changes. You'll have to play the game a few times to get the hang of switching players quickly enough to maintain ball control.

Eventually, you'll also discover how easily your opponents can be knocked down and you can steal the ball. Of course, they'll be eager to get the ball back, so Street Sports Basketball evolves into a combination basketball game and small street riot—fun for kids of any age.

GFL CHAMPIONSHIP FOOTBALL

Sometimes getting a new perspective on an old game offers some surprises. Such is the case with GFL Championship Football from Activision. As the program's packaging states, "No longer are you up in the stands watching the fleas on the left play the fleas on the right."

GFL Championship Football can be configured for play against another person or the computer. Using a joystick, you select one of the program's 27 teams, then control your chosen 11 by selecting offensive and defensive ball-moving options from a window.

While this program introduces worthy technological improvements and is an accurate representation of football play, I still don't feel comfortable with it. My uneasiness doesn't stem from the fact that the goal posts aren't clearly defined or the program is too slow. Rather, it's because ten years of video games has left me a traditionalist who prefers to sit up in the stands and control the football fleas.

4TH & INCHES

A late 1987 Accolade release, 4th & Inches is a football simulation that hit the market while I was in the midst of writing this article—which is a good thing, because it deserves mention.

You play this joystick-controlled game against another person or the computer. In the role of coach, you select your first-string players and their stats, ranging from "speed!" (fast but weak-kneed) to "big!" (slow and sure-footed). Once you're down on the field, you decide whether your team is playing defense or offense.

The atmosphere on the 4th & Inches gridiron is as action-intensive as real-life football. Get caught off guard for even a few seconds, and you'll get mauled or lose valuable yardage. The display follows the football, but unlike virtual scrolling, when long passes and kicks fly off the screen, the display is quickly updated to keep the ball in view. When the ball lands near you in the new display, you've got to respond correctly in a split second.

With its exceptional graphics, high-intensity action and excitement, 4th & Inches contains all the ingredients of a good football simulation.

FOOTBALL

Football, from Software Simulations, is a one- or two-player game for those who like to go beyond the detached perspective of the coach and call every move the players make. Plenty of mediocre graphics depict the field, yardlines and players, and, whether you're playing offense or defense, you have to use your joystick between plays to select your next move from menus.

I uncovered an interesting aspect of Football by mistake. When, as a quarterback with possession of the ball, I ran back 20 yards to elude my pursuers, I found that I could run on into infinity, with most of the opposing team in pursuit. After I let them catch up, I discovered my team had lost only 11 yards!

The 73-page user's manual offers a thorough explanation of how to play Football, but the terminology in the manual and in the game itself requires that you know the names of the various maneuvers ahead of time.

All told, Football is a fairly exciting, good-quality football simulation and a lot of fun to play.

SUPERSTAR ICE HOCKEY

Because the opposing teams in ice hockey talk loudly while carrying big sticks, some of the bloodiest, most spectacular fights imaginable routinely occur at professional games. Such full-blown knock 'em, sock 'em rink riots don't occur in Mindscape's Superstar Ice Hockey, which offers all the other major elements of realistic hockey. Fine graphic detail and virtual scrolling help make the game a first-rate product.

Superstar Ice Hockey pits you against either the computer or a friend. Using your joystick for making selections, you go through a coaching menu, then a player-recruiting menu where you select two, four or six individuals for your team and adjust their offensive and defensive abilities. You also choose Practice or Game mode, the number of minutes per period and whether the computer or the player controls the coach, center and goalie for each team, plus many other options. There's enough action in player trades, training camp, east and west divisions and team

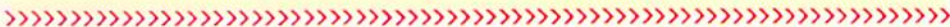
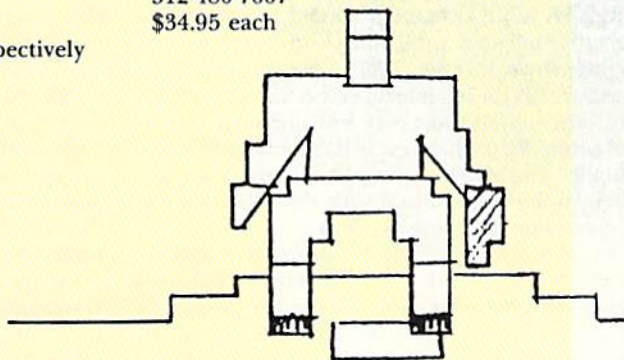

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histories to keep even ice hockey purists content.

Playing this game provides both fun and satisfaction. How much fun and satisfaction? Well, just imagine skating up to your opponent, whacking him with your hockey stick and sending him spinning like a top. Now, if that isn't the essence of hockey, I don't know what is.

As in real-life hockey, of course, such mischief doesn't go unpunished. I usually get thrown in the penalty box for 30 seconds, while my opponent camps out in front of my computer-controlled goalie and rapid-fires shots until one goes in the net.

Enough said in praise of Superstar Ice Hockey; I think most would-be hockey champs now have a good idea of the excitement and challenge this game offers.

SUPERSTAR SOCCER

Just as I was putting the finishing touches on this article, Superstar Soccer arrived in the *RUN*

editorial offices, and fortunately I was able to squeeze it in. Superstar Soccer treats you to detailed graphics that weren't available in C-64 programs until recently. The field of play appears on a virtual-scrolling screen similar to that of Superstar Ice Hockey. When you're at one end of the field and kick the ball hard enough to send it flying to the other end, the screen scrolls horizontally to keep the ball, but not necessarily the players, in view at all times.

Superstar Soccer operates in a real-time environment where you're on the front line battling against the opposing team. Your foe is either a friend or the computer. There's a lot more to this game than chasing and kicking a soccer ball. Along with playing, you also manage and coach the team, which means you recruit, train and trade players.

You begin your first game as the worst of 64 teams in the league, but with the aim of rising to be the reigning team in the division. Whether or not you make it, be sure to get a new joystick ▶

or two before starting your climb. You're liable to go through at least one in the process.

GENERAL SPORTS SIMULATIONS

Okay, let's suppose you're looking for a good sports simulation, but you're not interested in traditional games like baseball, football and hockey. You may be intrigued by two unique and highly enjoyable disks released late in 1987: Mindscape's Indoor Sports and California Games, from Epyx.

Indoor Sports provides graphics for playing darts, bowling and ping-pong that are some of the best you'll find in any C-64 program. In

California Games, you enjoy surfing, foot bag, half-pipe skateboarding, roller skating, BMX bicycling and frisbee throwing with detailed, realistic graphics that surpass even those in earlier Epyx programs, which were noted for their graphics accomplishments.

So, lace up your Nikes, grab your software and head for your C-64. There's a wide selection of exciting sports fun awaiting you, and the clock's about to start! ☐

...On the High Seas...

CREATE A REALISTIC FLIGHT simulator, especially one that puts you in the cockpit of a high-performance jet, and you've got instant excitement. With a realistic naval simulation, on the other hand, you may end up with instant boredom. First, the view is hardly breathtaking, usually consisting of little more than a static horizon, possibly dotted with the silhouettes of distant islands or enemy ships.

Second, things move a lot slower through the water than in the sky. Consequently, most C-64 naval simulations let you accelerate the flow of time so that a month-long mission can be compressed into a few playing hours. Even speeded up, however, combat at sea is a deliberate and calculated process.

SOFTWARE SUBS

Submarine attacks, for instance, are usually launched by slowly and silently closing in on the enemy like a cat sneaking up on a mouse. An end-run attack is often the best approach, requiring extra time to slip around to the front of an enemy convoy, where you can sit submerged and undetected as your targets float to within torpedo range.

Despite the necessarily slow pace and limited graphic potential of realistic submarine simulations, they're becoming increasingly popular with C-64 users. One reason is that because it takes so much patience and preparation to mount a successful torpedo attack, when you do finally sink an enemy ship, you feel a greater sense of accomplishment than the flight simulator pilot who simply soars through the sky blasting everything in sight.

Another stimulus to submarine simulation popularity is that they offer a much wider variety of strategic options than typical aerial combat

simulators. On a patrol mission, for instance, you can hunt down an enemy convoy at periscope-depth and immediately launch a torpedo attack, or you can wait until nightfall and try a daring surface attack.

Resource management is also extremely important over the course of a long mission, since you usually begin with only 24 torpedos and a limited amount of diesel fuel. Fuel can be conserved by using electric motors when possible, but a sub's batteries can't be used for long without recharging. Also, using electric power decreases your sub's top speed, so must be avoided when you're trying to outrun enemy destroyers.

SUB BATTLE SIMULATOR

The newest software submarine to hit the water, Epyx's Sub Battle Simulator, is an ambitious effort that offers many control options. After deciding whether to take charge of a German U-boat or a U.S. Navy submarine and choosing the year of your command (1939-1945), you are assigned one of 60 missions. These range from simple patrols to rescue missions. Advanced players can even tackle a wartime command that allows you to play every mission in sequence throughout the course of the war.

Unfortunately, despite the variety of missions and play options, Sub Battle Simulator fails to generate much real excitement, chiefly because of the program's slow response to keyboard input. Having to wait two or three seconds to see if your keystroke will be read correctly may build tension, but not the kind that results in an exciting simulation.

Another problem is static, jumpy animation that makes you feel as if you're watching a slide show of a naval battle rather than participating



in one. For example, as you rotate your periscope, using either the joystick or keyboard controls, the view changes every few seconds, but there is little illusion of any horizontal panning of sea.

UP PERISCOPE!

Of the three submarine simulations reviewed here, *Up Periscope!* offers the best blend of realism and playability. Instead of requiring you to access several different screens to check your maps, instruments, armaments and periscope view, *Up Periscope!* puts everything necessary to command your sub on one main screen. Without leaving this screen, you can check your fuel, battery and oxygen levels; look out across the ocean; check your sub's speed, depth and heading; study patrol maps; check your radar and sonar for enemy ships; or lock in your aim on an enemy ship by calling up your Torpedo Data Computer (TDC).

The secret of providing so much valuable in-

formation on one screen is a bridge view that shrinks to half its normal size on the left side of the screen, while maps, radar or the TDC are displayed on the right side. Other displays that are less frequently employed are loaded as separate screens.

SILENT SERVICE

Although all the same options and information found on *Up Periscope!*'s main screen are available to *Silent Service* players, the designers at MicroProse have used separate screens to display maps, instruments, reports and the periscope view. You select from the game's several screens by using a joystick-driven menu, cleverly disguised as a sub captain in a conning tower. Move the captain to the map table to examine your maps; move him to the periscope to access your periscope view; and so forth.

While both *Up Periscope!* and *Silent Service* let you simulate either short missions or long patrols, gamers who demand realism and histor- ▶

ical accuracy from their naval simulations will want to set sail with Up Periscope!. If, on the other hand, the idea of staring at a single screen through most of a lengthy patrol makes you seasick, you'll welcome the graphic variety of Silent Service.

SURFACE BATTLES

Two other popular naval simulations, Destroyer and PHM Pegasus, also place you in command of your own vessel. This time, however, you're up on the surface and, at least in the case of Destroyer, it's your turn to hunt down the submarines.

DESTROYER

One of the reasons Epyx's Sub Battle Simulator seems a disappointment is that their Destroyer is such a tremendous success. Destroyer puts you in the role of captain of a Fletcher-class destroyer based in the Pacific during World War II. You can play Destroyer at any one of three difficulty settings, and there are seven different types of missions to choose from: Subhunter, Screen, Scout, Bombardment, Convoy Escort, Rescue and Blockade Runner. Depending on the scenario and difficulty level you select, you may face enemy subs, warships, island gun emplacements, fighter planes, or some combination of all four. To combat each threat you must learn to use your four weapon systems.

Each weapon is fired from its own screen, and you can quickly move from one to another by entering the appropriate two-letter code. Destroyer also features separate screens for radar, sonar and navigation, as well as a bridge screen that serves as a link to all other systems. Each

screen is rich in color and graphic detail, and animated sequences such as the attacks by enemy fighters are superb.

PHM PEGASUS

For those of you who'd like to experience a naval simulation based on a modern patrol vessel, rather than one of WWII vintage, PHM Pegasus, by Electronic Arts, is worthy of consideration. Pegasus is a Patrol Hydrofoil Missilecraft (PHM), equipped with a 76mm cannon and two types of guided missiles, as well as electronic radar and tracking systems like those in today's high-tech jet fighters. In addition, some missions also require you to control two auxiliary helicopters that provide additional radar coverage.

Instead of the usual convoy escort missions through the German- or Japanese-patrolled waters of World War II, Pegasus gives you a choice of eight up-to-date missions. You may choose, for example, to escort a supply ship out of the Persian Gulf. To reach the ship, you have to sail through the Straits of Hormuz to Kuwait. Perhaps the most interesting thing about this scenario is that it was designed several months before the U.S. warships actually began escorting Kuwaiti tankers through the Gulf. In other contemporary missions, you intercept and sink terrorist patrol vessels in the Mediterranean or photograph cargo ships suspected of smuggling arms to a South American dictator.

MULTIPLE-SHIP SIMULATIONS

For some, the most exciting naval simulations are those that let you command, not just a single ship or submarine, but an entire task group or carrier force, consisting of several warships that



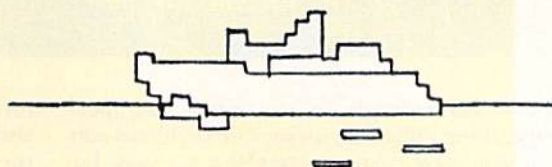

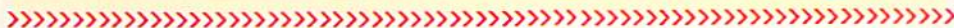
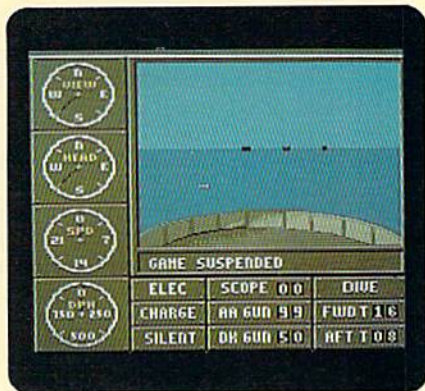

WARSHIP AND BATTLECRUISER

One of the best games of this type is SSI's Warship, a game of tactical surface combat that lets you recreate historical naval battles between the U.S and Japanese navies during the Second World War. Warship features four pre-designed scenarios and 79 different classes of Dutch, U.S., British and Japanese ships, ranging from battleships to transports. You may even design your own ships and maps to create original scenarios.

A naval simulation with gameplay that's virtually identical to that of Warship is Battlecruiser, also by SSI. Like Warship, Battlecruiser lets you lead up to 20 ships into battle on the open seas. This time, however, the setting is the Atlantic and the game's eight historical scenarios are divided evenly between the First and Second World Wars.

It isn't the graphics that makes these games so realistic (both use plain white ship icons against a featureless black ocean); it's the fine attention to historical detail and accuracy. For example, each of the ships is rated individually for max-

imum speed, armor thickness, radar and number and types of guns. Even though SSI has given both Warship and Battlecruiser "advanced" ratings, players having little experience with map-based naval simulations should be able to do well after reading through the manuals once or twice and (more importantly) watching a demo game.


BISMARCK

Just when I thought my roundup of naval simulations was complete, Datasoft released Bismarck: The North Sea Chase. Bismarck is an interesting combination of battleship simulation and wargame that puts you in charge of either the British Royal Navy or the famous German battleship. As commander of the British forces, your job is to hunt down and sink the Bismarck before it can reach the southern edge of the map; and for the German commander, the objective is to sink at least one British battleship, aircraft carrier or convoy.

Whenever British and German forces clash on the battle map, you're given an opportunity to take control of any ships that are directly involved in the engagement. The action screen you ▶

use during battle lets you fire the ship's main guns or torpedos, close in on the enemy ship, pull away, or maintain the current distance. During some battles, you can even launch carrier-based torpedo plane raids against the Bismarck.

Although Bismarck is an enjoyable game, veteran war-gamers will find that it offers too little strategic challenge. Fans of games like Up Periscope! and Destroyer will probably be disap-

pointed with Bismarck's lack of realism and tactical options. However, anyone interested in a beginner's level game that combines elements of both action simulations and map-based wargaming should give Bismarck a try.

...In the Air

THE FLIGHT SIMULATOR was one of the most popular of the early computer games. It first appeared for the Apple computer in the form of SubLogic's Flight Simulator I program, which, by current standards, was extremely slow and had crude graphics. Yet in its time, it was quite an achievement and was the precursor of several generations of entertainment and educational software, including Flight Simulator II for the C-64, also from SubLogic.

Since the release of FS2 for the C-64, there's been a steady output of flight simulators of various craft for both peace-time and combat situations. And the last quarter of 1987 has seen the release of several new and innovative C-64 programs.

PROJECT: STEALTH FIGHTER

One of the best of these releases is Project: Stealth Fighter from MicroProse. This game simulates the F19 Stealth fighter plane the military reportedly has been developing. (The name Stealth comes from the phrase "stealth technology," which refers to various techniques designed to make the craft undetectable by enemy radar and defense systems.) Project: Stealth Fighter comes with over 100 pages of documentation, maps and keyboard overlays that, combined with some sophisticated graphics programming, offer one of the most realistic combat simulations yet released to the C-64 gaming community.

The Stealth Fighter is controlled via a combination of keyboard and joystick controls. Part of the screen display contains your view from the cockpit. Overlying the viewing area is the Head-Up Display, which gives you critical information necessary for flying the aircraft, such as pitch, heading, roll, airspeed and altitude. It may also contain a weapon gunsight that indicates an enemy's position. The lower half of the screen shows the cockpit control panel containing indicator lights, gauges and system displays.

Before going into combat, where the enemy

will make every effort to cut your flight short, you can practice flying and attacking. Then you can attack geographical areas in North Africa, Central Europe—even Lybia and the Persian Gulf. The high-resolution graphics screen is updated quite quickly.

Stealth Fighter is meant to be a serious simulation of the stealth fighter and its missions. While it can be fast-paced and arcade-like in play, it is not a simple shoot-'em-up.

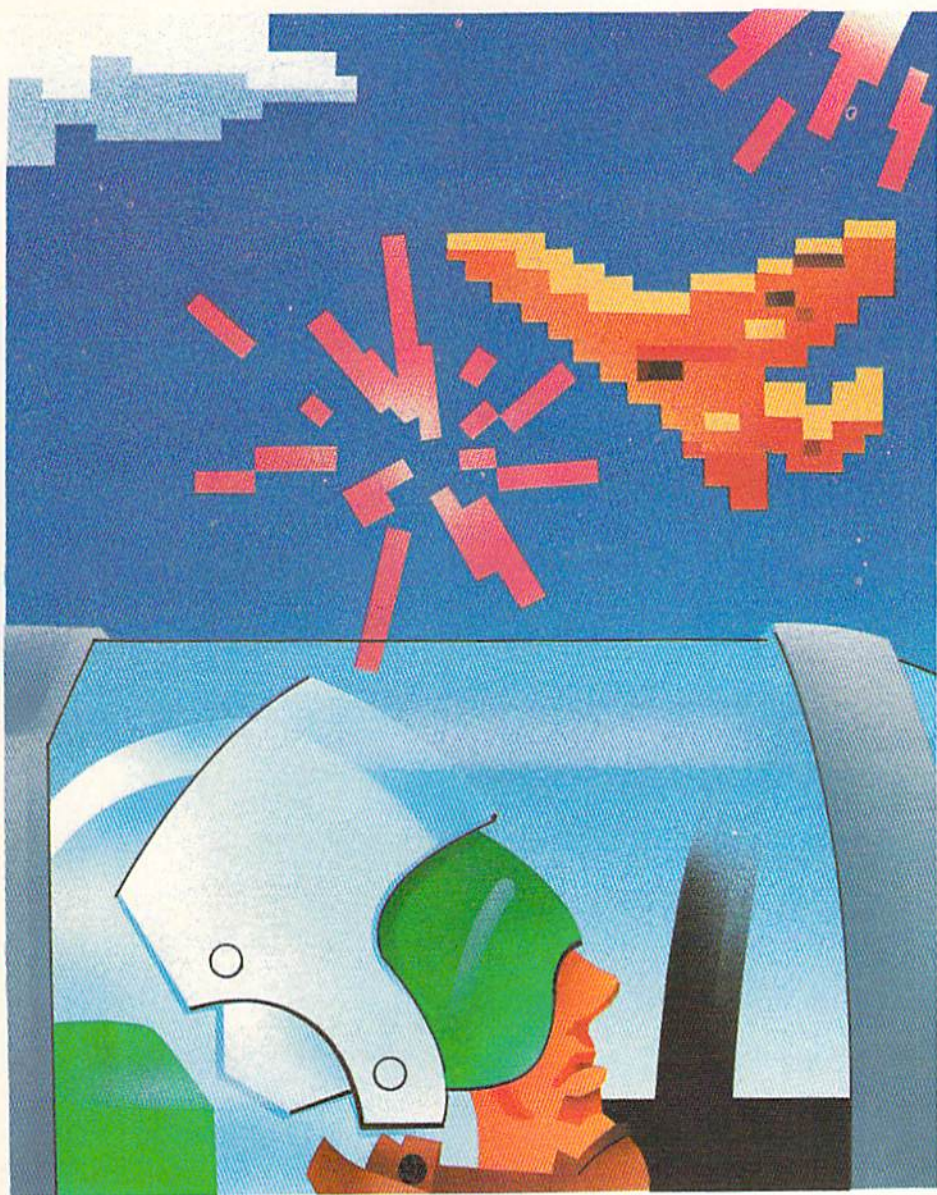
ECHELON

Heading into space brings us to another new entry in flight simulation. This is Echelon, from Access Software. In this space-flight simulation, which is more arcade-like than Stealth Fighter, you're the pilot of a C-104 spacecraft based at a space station in near-Earth orbit. Your mission is to defend Earth from space pirates, explore new regions of space and try to find the space pirates' stronghold.

The cockpit display combines a control panel and a viewscreen showing a three-dimensional grid that represents the planet's terrain and surface structures such as buildings. You control the craft's banking and rolling motions with the joystick and press the fire-button to increase or decrease your speed.

The use of weapons (missiles, photon cannon and high-density anti-proton projectiles) in Echelon brings us to an innovative feature that distinguishes the program from other arcade games—the LipStik. The LipStik is a headset with a voice-activated switch in the microphone, and while it's not a true voice-recognition system, you do use your voice to activate the C-104's weapons. Just say "Fire!" (or any other word) to launch a missile or fire the cannon. While the LipStik is being sold separately, a special version of it is included in the Echelon package.

I really like Echelon. The graphics are well done, but then so are all the others in this new generation of flight simulations. The combat is



fast and fun, and the Exploration mode has much in common with an adventure game.

THUNDERCHOPPER

Back on earth again, we switch from spaceship to helicopter combat in ActionSoft's Thunderchopper. This game uses graphics techniques licensed from SubLogic, which is known for its fast, three-dimensional graphics. This simulation puts you inside the Hughes 530 MG Defender helicopter and offers a variety of scenarios, including combat, rescue, escort and simple flying excursions.

Depending on the mode of play selected, you'll be given a set of orders on targets or goals. You might guard a convoy from enemy gun installations. This requires you to seek out and find the source of the incoming shells and take out the enemy before they get you or the convoy. In Combat mode you'll be ordered to destroy a set of targets, such as bridges or buildings; at other

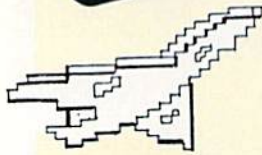
times, you'll get orders to destroy moving objects such as trucks, tanks or aircraft.

Depending on the target, you must find it, choose the appropriate weapon system and destroy it. All the time you must keep an eye on the available fuel and the number of rounds left for each weapon. If you've wasted all your rockets or missiles destroying trucks, you won't be able to destroy a bridge with your machine guns, and you won't accomplish your mission.

It's inevitable that Thunderchopper will be compared with Gunship, from MicroProse. Both are helicopter-combat simulations that use 3-D graphics displays. But there is a distinct difference. Gunship, like Project: Stealth Fighter, has simulations that are much more complex and detailed. To play them effectively requires a good deal of reading, thought and practice. Thunderchopper, while also striving to be a realistic simulation, has more of an arcade quality. It doesn't require nearly as much study to play, and its manual is smaller and easier to follow. So the ▶

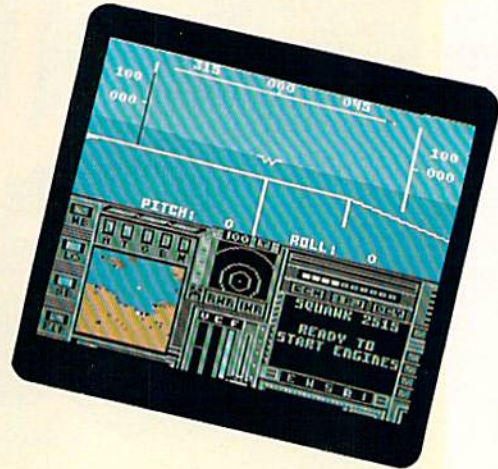

two games are aimed at different audiences. Personally, what I liked most about Thunderchopper was the arcade aspect.

CHUCK YEAGER'S ADVANCED FLIGHT TRAINER

From Electronic Arts comes Chuck Yeager's Advanced Flight Trainer. This is a non-combat flight simulator that gives you a feel for what it is like to fly very fast experimental aircraft.

The Advanced Flight Trainer has the fastest screen update of the four flight simulators I looked at. Like the others, you have a screen display that has a control panel, complete with gauges, dials and gadgets as well as a full-color view screen that gives you a pilot's-eye view of the 3-D terrain. And the terrain is more detailed than the other packages, making this program more interesting for simple sightseeing flights.

There are three levels of operation. The first teaches basic flight skills, like take-offs and land-

ings; the second instructs you in advanced maneuvers; and the third is stunt flying, including playing follow-the-leader with Chuck Yeager, who may well leave you in his flight vapor!

You have a number of craft to choose from, from ancient models like the Sopwith Camel (with no beagle to help you) and the P-51 Mustang, to modern craft like the SR-71 Blackbird and the F18. Once you reach a certain level of expertise, you can try your hand at flying one of three experimental planes. However, you never know what will happen with those untested craft!

For me, this was the most fun of all the programs. I quickly tire of war games, and real-world simulations take too much thinking. With Chuck Yeager's Advanced Flight Trainer, I got to do just what I wanted, which is fly, and fly fast! ■

Take Stock Of Investment Software

As the recent collapse of the stock market attests, investing is a risky business.



It was a crash heard round the world. On October 19, 1987, the stock market plummeted, and investors have been nervous ever since. Curiously, however, on the Tuesday after Black Monday, brokers' offices were flooded with customers who wanted to open new accounts, not close old ones.

Wall Street is a jungle where bulls and bears are always on the prowl, and, as Black Monday and the day after illustrated, no one can predict which way the market will go. For every observer who says it will skyrocket, there's another who says it will plummet. However, they all agree on one thing: Anyone who plays this market needs plenty of help; these days, a computer isn't a luxury for investors—it's a necessity.

To this end, there are now a number of investment programs available for the C-64 and C-128. Like stocks themselves, some are winners, some are losers, and some are blue chips worthy of the software ►

Fortune 500. In this article, I'll survey four of these programs and also make brief mention of a few others, all of which can help you keep those bulls and bears under control.

TYPES OF INVESTMENT SOFTWARE

There are three distinct groups of investment software, with different tasks and different purposes. Financial analysis software screens companies' records for certain fundamental conditions that would make their stock a viable investment. Portfolio management software records the transactions in an investor's portfolio and then prints them out in various formats. Technical analysis software displays stock data in charts and graphs that a knowledgeable per-



son can use to spot trends and predict if the stock will go higher or lower.

Any investment software package should adequately fulfill its main purpose and also be easy to use, even for those not versed in economics or business. In addition, the documentation should be well written and understandable, the program should have a certain elegance and sophistication, and, most important, its results should be accurate.

So, let's take a look at some of the most popular investment software available today for the C-64 and C-128. Refer to Table 1 for distributor information and prices.

PERSONAL PORTFOLIO MANAGER

A portfolio management program is a database for recording and reporting your invest-

ment transactions, not, as some suppose, an analytical tool for predicting which stock to buy or a device for charting stock movements. As a database, it should keep good, clear records, so you'll know at any time how much you're making (or losing). Come income tax time, the program should be able to print out a record of the year's gains and losses. Personal Portfolio Manager by Abacus does all this and more—and does it well.

There are two versions of PPM—one for the C-64 and one for the C-128. The latter supports both 40 and 80 columns.

The program is straightforward, so even as a beginner, you should be able to electronically record your portfolio in just a few hours. One word of warning, though: Don't forget to use the Exit program when you're done, or you'll lose all the data from that session.

PPM keeps good, professional records of investments. It separates the open stocks (those you currently hold) from the closed (those that you've sold), and it keeps complete year-to-date records that make a breeze out of completing the dreaded Schedule D of form 1040.

In addition, PPM can automatically dial the Dow Jones and Warner quote services to update your portfolio—even when you're not home! Or you can enter the quote information yourself, using the daily newspaper as your source.

The master disk comes with five report programs that should cover virtually all your needs. If not, you can customize the programs to print out reports any way you wish.

I used PPM with two printers, a Star NX-10 and a PowerType daisy wheel. The reports generated were clean, precise and professional.

I've seen programs like PPM for the IBM PC at a cost of \$400-\$500. Abacus's Personal Portfolio Manager does what its cousins do at a fraction of the cost. This program would make an excellent addition to any investor's software library.

TECHNICAL ANALYSIS SYSTEM

Believe it or not, there's an investment technique that's touted as able to pick a winning stock without any data on the financial state of the company. Called technical analysis, it involves charting and graphing a stock, using data such as high, low and closing prices, volume and moving averages. From these graphs, a technician can discern certain trends that indicate whether the stock will move higher, lower or even sideways.

Proponents of technical analysis say it's similar to a doctor reading a hospital chart and predicting whether the patient will get healthier or sicker. Its detractors say it's more like reading an astrology chart—and about as scientific. One thing is certain: The Technical Analysis System by Abacus is every bit as good as similar programs offered for the IBM PC—at one-tenth the cost.

Abacus makes both C-64 and C-128 versions of TAS, and I reviewed the latter. An 80-column program, TAS 128 takes full advantage of the hires capabilities of the 8563 chip. The charts are displayed in various formats, and the printouts are professional. ►

Online Help for Investors

VESTOR, AN ON-LINE SERVICE from Investment Technologies, provides you with market research data and analyses formerly available only to professional money managers. Requiring no special software, it features more than 20 evaluative programs and an almost equal number of user help files and utilities, along with a comprehensive user's guide.

All you need to get online with Vestor is a 300- or 1200-baud modem and communications software. Vestor's VAX 11/785 computers, located in New Jersey, can be accessed directly or via Telenet. Several information services, including The Source, GENie and Quotron, also offer gateways to Vestor.

The service is remarkably easy to use. Two-letter codes take you directly to a series of programs that screen, analyze, chart and rank the potential of investment opportunities in any of four areas: stocks, options, futures and market averages. A database of historical information on over 6000 issues from the New York Stock Exchange, American Stock Exchange and Over the Counter markets forms the foundation of the programs and is instantly available to support your research.

The standard report prepared by Vestor's Evaluate program provides daily technical analyses of price trend lines, performance predictions, Alpha (relative to market) and Beta (volatility) ratings and reward-to-risk ratios. Vestor also generates an Investment Strategy Rating for each stock, combining technical and fundamental predictions and evaluations.

BOON TO INVESTORS

Savvy investors will quickly learn how to set their own performance, yield and marketability parameters and conduct a search of every stock on the system. Option traders can follow issues with a pair of standard chart reports, one of which uses current prices while the market is open. The bar chart generated by Vestor's OpPlot program is calculated by applying 14 proprietary formulas to determine what a particular option's price "ought" to be.

If terms like price trend lines, moving averages and graded buy/sell signals are enough to send you to the bank to buy savings bonds, Vestor's newest program, TellMe, will help. It reduces the technical charts and jargon to unadorned English and presents an easy-to-read, computer-based technical opinion of a stock's rating and potential.

Two other Vestor programs will also appeal to the less sophisticated investor. Select provides a list of five stocks that have a favorable reward-to-risk ratio. Updated weekly, it also supplies a commentary on the fundamentals of each company. Model offers a portfolio of ten Vestor-selected issues as a guide for possible long positions in the stock market. Of course, despite having outperformed the Dow Jones Index for over 20 years, Vestor offers no assurances of future performance.

MyRecord, one of Vestor's utility programs, duplicates the record-keeping function of many personal financial programs by maintaining a list of your transactions and preparing reports on your holdings or realized profits and losses. This program happens to be one of the few inadequate features of Vestor, primarily because of its inability to evaluate current holdings.

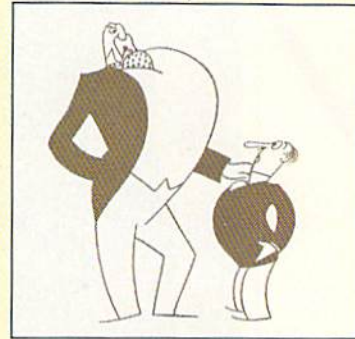
In contrast, another Vestor utility, called MyList, is most useful. It lets you automate much of your time on the system by storing lists of stocks that can all be run through an analysis program at once.

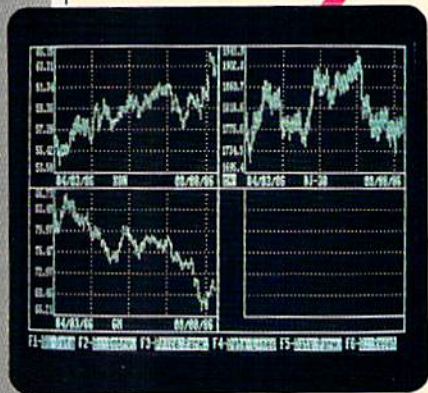
AT A MODEST COST

The price for this powerful information service is surprisingly low. The initial subscription fee of \$49.95 includes the excellent 200-page user's guide and 30 days of unlimited access. After the first month, individual reports are billed at \$1-\$3 per issue. Investment Technologies offers a bounty of one month's free service if you provide referrals who sign up as permanent subscribers.

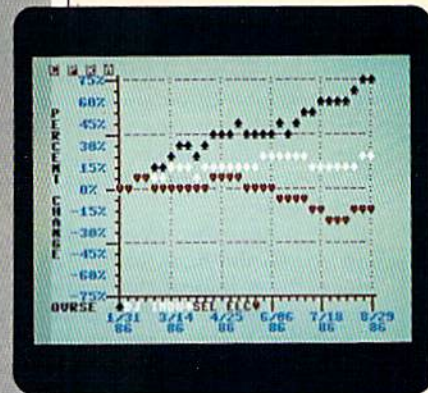
Telenet charges 20 cents per minute. If you access Vestor through an online service such as The Source, you'll avoid the initial fee, but charges for each stock analyzed or screened are double those paid by a Vestor subscriber.

With its large database, relatively modest fee schedule and no monthly minimums, Vestor is an attractive alternative for the occasional investor, as well as the discount brokerage customer. For further information, contact Investment Technologies, Inc., 519 Thornhall St., Edison, NJ 08837. ☐

Playing the Investment Game

WOULD YOU LIKE TO BE A MILLIONAIRE? If so, you can realize your dreams—in a way—with just your C-64 and the investment simulation game of your choice.

The New York Stock Exchange, for instance, is the setting for Insight's The Financial Time Machine, which first appeared in 1985. In this game, designed for up to four players, you choose any five-year period between 1930 and 1984 and a starting "stake" of \$25,000, \$50,000 or \$100,000. Then you buy and sell 27 common stocks, options, gold, Treasury bills and shares of a real estate index in an attempt to increase your holdings. The program provides updates on the status of your portfolio, your net worth, your cash flow, the current values of available investments, news events that may affect prices and the prime rate. It also lets you buy on margin and issue stop-loss limit orders.

Blue Chip Software distributes three investment simulations that were first released about 1983: a stock market game called Millionaire, a real estate game called Baron and a commodities game called Tycoon. All three have the same basic structure, are played by only one person and have a goal of amassing a net worth of \$1 million or more. The programs calculate taxes, commissions and interest on loans and margin purchases, and they let you save your current net worth from one game to the next.

The Blue Chip games come with detailed instruction booklets that are far clearer than The Financial Time Machine's brief pamphlet. However, they suffer from long disk-access times at the start of a new game—more than 15 minutes for Millionaire, more than six minutes for Baron and more than 11 minutes for Tycoon—and they're incompatible with the Epyx Fast Load cartridge. Fortunately, reloading saved games takes less than three minutes.

DECISIONS, DECISIONS

In Millionaire, you must increase your initial \$10,000 a hundredfold within 78 rounds of market activity. Aiding your decisions on whether to buy or sell 15 stocks and their options are brief news updates, corporate histories and charts that track the performance of individual stocks, industry groups and the market as a whole.

Baron is played on a "turf" encompassing the real estate markets of six states. You have 60 turns, spanning five years, in which to parlay \$35,000 into seven figures. Play options include buying and selling residential buildings, business facilities and land, plus options on these properties, and you can place your excess cash in interest-producing second mortgages. Baron's trading aids include property descriptions, bulletins announcing major events and statistics and graphs showing fluctuations in market sectors.

The third Blue Chip simulation, Tycoon, provides 52 weeks in which to build your initial stake of \$10,000 up to a million by trading in 15 commodities, including soybeans, Swiss Francs, pork bellies and the Standard & Poor's Index. Like Millionaire and Baron, Tycoon alerts you to news events and provides market descriptions. However, it adds a fictitious trader, named, appropriately enough, Cheat, whose net worth of \$250,000 an unscrupulous gamer can assume for an undeserved head start toward his or her first million.

Some Commodore gamers may consider The Financial Time Machine and the Blue Chip programs dull, because of their minimal sound effects, rather static graphics and lengthy playing times. However, if you enjoy thinking, they'll probably be among your favorites. Tycoon is especially challenging in letting you make money even when the market value of your portfolio declines.

DO GAMES HELP IN REAL LIFE?

Can these games help the experienced investor in real-life markets? Probably not. For one thing, they simulate only speculation, not long-term investment. Also, some of their assumptions are invalid for actual trading. For example, both Baron and The Financial Time Machine include long- and short-term capital gains, a distinction that recent tax legislation has largely erased.

All four of these games do match reality in one important respect: Like authentic markets, they're difficult to master. If they help you appreciate how much effort is needed to succeed in the real financial world, you'll have learned a valuable lesson.

Like Personal Portfolio Manager, its sister program, TAS can call up Dow Jones and Warner to get quotes. Since these services maintain a day-by-day listing of price quotes for at least a year, they provide substantial histories to type into TAS.

Be forewarned that, while TAS is easy to learn, technical analysis is not. The program's documentation gives good background information, but, if you're unfamiliar with technical analysis, you'll need to seek out a textbook on the subject in the library. Otherwise, the charts may look like meaningless jumbles of lines.

The power of this program is enormous, and, once you know something about technical analysis, it won't be long before you're writing macros to take advantage of its vast capabilities. Abacus's Technical Analysis System is a winner.

MUTUAL FUND PROSPECTOR

Many small investors have come to the painful realization that picking the right stock isn't easy. Too often, while the market resembles a herd of stampeding bulls, your portfolio lies there like a dead fish.

The answer for many has been investing in mutual funds, in which you buy a share of a fund that's managed by professionals. Over the past few years, most mutual funds have proven to be excellent investments.

Okay, so you no longer have to worry about which stock to buy, but which mutual fund should you choose? *The Wall Street Journal* lists scores of them, each with a number of subdivisions, so picking a good mutual fund may look as hard as picking a good stock.

That's where Mutual Fund Prospector, which tracks families of mutual funds, can help. You input the closing prices for each fund once a week; then the program determines which has performed best over a given period of time. In addition, the Moving Average program calculates an entire fund's performance, giving you an overall look at the quality of its management.

MFP's instruction manual is well written, and the program itself is straightforward. You can chart as many as five funds at once and print out several lists, with the funds ranked in order of performance. One weakness, unfortunately, is that the printout of the graphs is less than professional-looking.

You must input a history of each fund's closing prices to build up a database for analyzing trends, but once this research is complete, doing the weekly updates is easy. All in all, Mutual Fund Prospector is a fine program that should help you choose the right mutual fund.

Aspen Glen Software has introduced two new programs that complement Mutual Fund Prospector. The Moving Average Explorer helps investors discover the most advantageous number of weeks to use for the moving average calculations of the funds they're following.

The second program, File Manager, allows you to add additional data to existing Prospector files, and it also provides a spreadsheet-like printout.

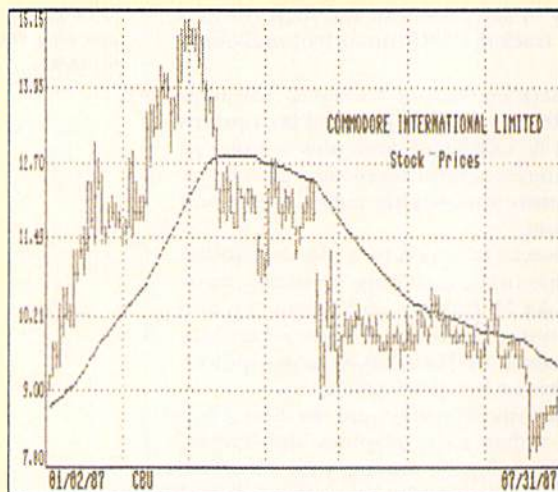
INVESTMENT SIMULATION PROGRAM

Well, now that you've made a killing in the market, what next? Build a multimillion-dollar apartment complex or put up a 100-story skyscraper? If you're in that league, then the Investment Simulation Program from Pyxis is for you. This package is used to analyze long-term investments and predict if and when a major project (usually involving real estate) will become profitable.

There are separate programs on the disk for the C-64 and the C-128, with the 128 version supporting both 40 and 80 columns. In order for you to get a proper hard copy, your printer must be capable of compressed mode (about 136 characters per line).

ISP is flexible, and the professional printouts offer an accurate appraisal of a project's potential—assuming you know enough about business investing to feed in accurate data. And there's the rub. This program is for knowledgeable users only. The documentation, written in technical jargon, assumes a familiarity with the basics of

Commodore: Sailin' On



C-64 AND C-128 USERS ARE KEENLY AWARE of the rollercoaster fortunes of Commodore International. Over the past four years, the company's stock has been as high as 60 and as low as 5.

On July 21, 1987, the stock hit a calendar-year low of 5. Which way was it headed from there? I used the Abacus Technical Analysis System to find out.

The vertical lines on the chart show the daily price range of Commodore stock (CBU is the ticker symbol) for the first seven months of 1987. Notice the line through the stock prices. It's called the 60-day moving average. The fact that Commodore was trading considerably beneath its moving average was one indication to technical analysts that its stock would move higher, despite the recent downturn.


And did it? Well, 60 days later, on September 21, Commodore stock was selling for 9 3/4, a gain of 22 percent!

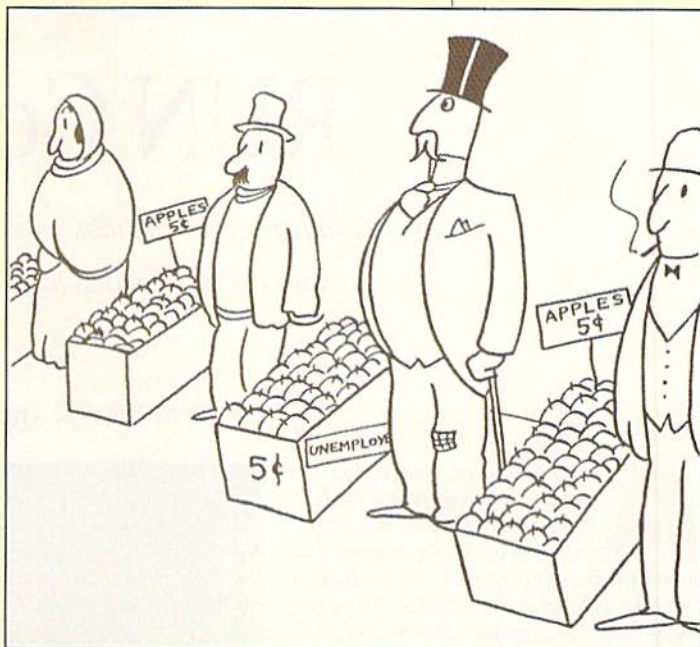

investment and finance. However, if you have a lot of money to invest and business experience to back it up, ISP will serve you well.

FOOTNOTES

Strategist, from Strategy Software, arrived too late for me to review, but it's worth mentioning. Designed for the C-128, this program starts with a large historical quote file and a trading strategy you specify. Then it simulates realistic trades to see how well or poorly the strategy would have paid off. The program goes through the historical file over and over, varying the strategy a little each time, until it finds the one with the best payoff. The package includes the main program; two supporting programs that create historical files and track week-to-week price activity; several utility programs; and several years of quotes for a fictional insurance company.

In addition to dedicated software, spreadsheet programs can also be used as portfolio managers.

Microsoft Multiplan, a C-64 and C-128 program (originally from Epyx, but now available through mail order or computer stores), even has a template called Stock Portfolio right on the disk.

Spreadsheets are more flexible than dedicated stock programs, so you can set them up in any format you wish. They're also faster than the typical portfolio manager, because all your data is in one file, and usually on one screen.

However, you lose some of the excellent features of a good portfolio manager. For example, the ability to print out reports is curtailed, and you can't tie into quote services. Also, you need to come up with formulas to enter on your own, and spreadsheets take more work to update.

So, there's a look at some of the investment software that's available for you and your Commodore. Now, off you go to stalk those bulls and bears. Good luck and happy hunting! ■

RUN Copy 64

Tired of twiddling your thumbs while backing up those important data disks? Try this high-speed disk copier.



By DAVID MARTIN and PETER PATEL

As many Commodore owners know, copying disks with a 1541 disk drive and its accompanying backup program is a slow and frustrating process. In fact, it can take as long as 20 minutes. We wrote RUN Copy to alleviate this problem. It lets you make a disk copy in three minutes or less—a more than 500 percent increase in speed!

Normal 1541 copying is slow because only one bit of data at a time is sent over the serial data line. RUN Copy achieves its speed by placing a special program in the drive's RAM and special input/output routines in the computer's RAM. These enable the drive to send or receive two bits of data at a time, one over the serial data line and one over the serial clock line.

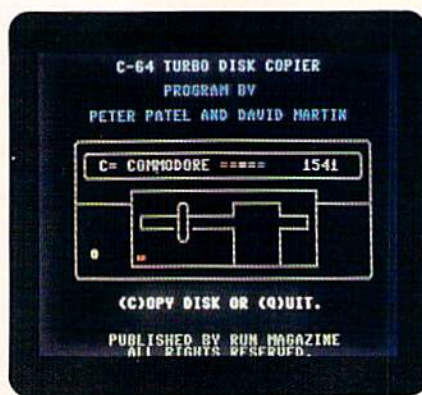
Type in RUN Copy, using RUN's Checksum program, and then save it to disk. Before running it, shut off the computer, remove all cartridges and make sure every peripheral on the serial bus except the one 1541 is disconnected or turned off. Any extra peripherals could interfere with the program.

RUN Copy duplicates all the sectors on the source disk, regardless of their allocation status. Therefore, if you plan on backing up a disk that contains only a couple of short files, you'd save time by using a file copier instead.

MAKING COPIES

When you run the program, the title screen asks if you want to copy or quit. Assuming you want to copy, enter C; then, at the next prompt, place a write-protected source disk in the drive and press return to start the copying process. As the data moves, keep an eye on the 1541 picture on the screen; its drive light operates in sync with the real drive's light.

Soon the bell rings, and a prompt to insert a copy disk appears. Be sure your copy disk doesn't contain any programs

or other files you need, because the data from the source disk will obliterate them.

Insert the copy disk and press return. After a short wait, a prompt to switch

back to the source disk appears. It takes three of these source-disk-copy-disk sequences to complete the copy. When it's done, press return to go to the main prompt, then C to make another copy or Q to quit.

ERROR HANDLING

If an error is encountered during copying, RUN Copy tells you at the end of the current pass on which disk the error occurred. The duplication process isn't aborted, because RUN Copy is able to remove disk errors. It will repair data, however, only in sectors containing a #22 or #23 error. Other errors are removed so the program can proceed, but the restored data from these bad sectors will be of unpredictable content. □

The 1351 mouse is certainly a boon to the C-128, but support for it has so far been limited mostly to applications software. We spend a great deal of time writing and editing our own Basic programs and have often wished we could use a mouse for positioning the cursor in listings and scrolling through program lines. So, we set out to add mouse support to the C-128 for editing Basic code.

On the surface, this looks like a trivial exercise in reading the joystick/mouse ports and positioning the cursor accordingly. However, the situation is complicated by the facts that the cursor position must be updated very frequently and that the code to do this must fit in memory with the Basic interpreter and the C-128's wonderful, but complicated, screen editor.

Ordinarily, it's easy to create a C-128 program that runs "constantly" in the background by wedging into the IRQ interrupt-handling routine—that part of the operating system that's called on 60 times a second to perform mundane, but vital, tasks such as cursor-flashing, scanning all input devices, updating the system clock and handling various screen functions. Wedging into this routine is accomplished by altering its indirect vectors to point to the custom routine you want to invoke. After the computer executes your routine, it goes to the normal IRQ code to handle the jobs described above.

This scheme functions flawlessly in 40-Column mode, but there's a problem in 80-Column mode. The 8563 video display controller handles operations such as scrolling the screen through multiple-instruction sequences, and if you interrupt the flow of data, the computer performs erratically or even locks up. In fact, page 293 of the *C-128 Programmer's Reference Guide* states that "You should not, directly or indirectly, access the 8563 during interrupts..."



After months of seeking a way to avoid interrupting screen-editor activity, we contacted Fred Bowen, Commodore's C-128 expert, and he devised a method that works. It involves checking the stack for a return address that points to the screen editor's delay loop, a bit of code where the screen editor idles when it's not performing normal housekeeping chores. When this address is on the stack, it's okay to proceed with the wedge mouse routines; when it's not, the normal interrupt routine is executed. If you're an assembly language programmer, you might want to study this routine with the C-128's built-in machine language monitor, beginning at address \$14CE (5326).

INSERTING THE WEDGE

Using *RUN's* Checksum program, type in Listing 1 and save it to disk with *DSAVE "MOUSE LOADER"*. When you run it, you'll be prompted to insert a disk into your drive (device 8) and press a key, thus creating a binary disk file called Mouse Editor.

To load the wedge into your computer, either before or during a pro-

gramming session, enter *BLOAD "MOUSE EDITOR"*, and activate it with *SYS 4865*. At the top of the screen, you'll see a message saying the mouse editor is active, along with the last line of any Basic program in memory. If there's no Basic program in memory, a message to that effect appears.

MOUSING AROUND

With the wedge activated, you position the cursor by holding down the left button on the mouse and rolling it in the direction you want the cursor to move. You're also free to use the keyboard, including all of the C-128's screen-editor functions.

If you position the cursor over the Basic line at the top of the screen, then hold the left button down and roll the mouse upward, your Basic listing will scroll backward. Similarly, you can scroll forward through a listing by placing the cursor on the bottom line of the program, pressing the left mouse button and rolling the mouse downward. In fact, you can start scrolling from any point in the program by entering a line number, followed by a space, at the top or bottom of the screen and then rolling the mouse up or down.

If there's no Basic line number on the ▶

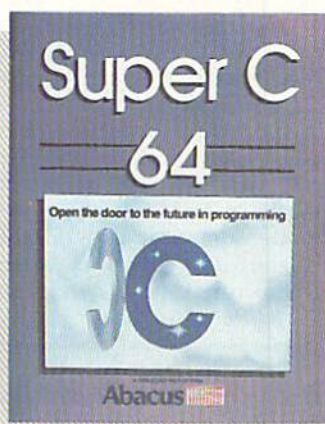
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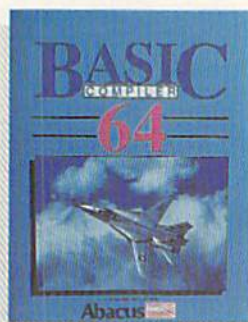
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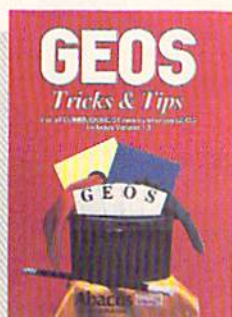


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MOUSE EDITOR

screen, you can use the function keys to set flags to turn off the mouse and prevent scrolling beyond the listing. The F4 key, redefined as "SYS 5178" + CHR\$(13), turns off the wedge, and the F6 key, redefined as "SYS 4865" + CHR\$(13), reactivates it. To clear these flags, turn the wedge off and on.

Another handy feature of the mouse editor is fast access to Text Insert mode. Just press the right mouse button to toggle in and out. Also, because the mouse editor doesn't interfere with Basic and Screen Editor commands, you're free to use escape sequences and change

Basic lines by retyping them and pressing return. You can even use the wedge with the C-128's built-in machine language monitor and for positioning the cursor on memory dumps or disassemblies. However, the forward-and-reverse scroll feature works only with Basic programs.

Note that we deactivated the F8 key's normal MONITOR + CHR\$(13) function, because of the way the C-128 reads the mouse buttons. If we hadn't, the operating system might mistake the mouse button for F8 and activate the machine language monitor.

Be sure to disable the wedge before executing a Basic program, because the two programs might be incompatible. The same holds true when you're performing disk operations. Of course, altering the IRQ interrupt vector or poking data into the area between addresses \$1301 and \$1981 (4865 and 6529) renders the wedge useless. **R**

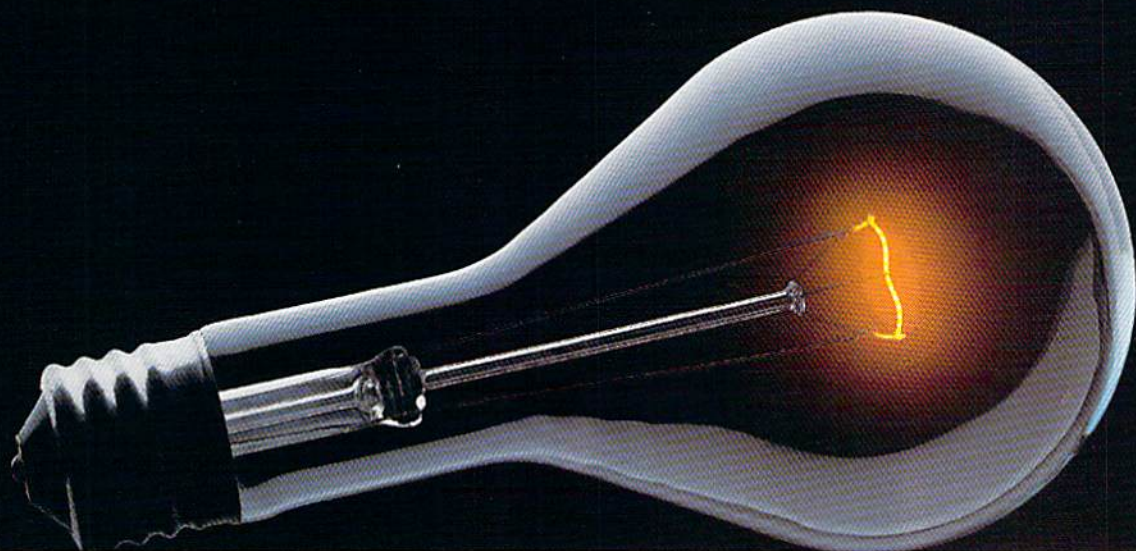

GEOWATCH

A look at Mystic Jim Shareware, a clock/calendar, art clips and compatibility with Word Writer 3.

When is an operating system not an operating system? Until other developers begin to support it. MS-DOS was just a collection of cryptic commands before Lotus 1-2-3 came along. And the Apple Macintosh was just a pretty assortment of menus and windows until companies like Microsoft and Aldus made it do useful things.

GEOS has not yet attracted the volume of third-party support now enjoyed by MS-DOS and the Macintosh, but there are independent developers writing products expressly for it. You may have to hunt to find them.

MYSTIC JIM SHAREWARE

The first place to look is Denver, Colorado. There you will find probably the largest GEOS developer outside of Berkeley. Mystic Jim has a growing collection of GEOS utilities, clip art, fonts and educational games (including geoKids, described in last December's geoWatch). Mystic Jim's shareware collection includes a number of useful GEOS utilities, some of the best of which are:

GEODump, a desk accessory that makes a graphic printout of your screen. You can use it to print the contents of your disk, make a quick hard copy of a graphic, or produce screen dumps for manuals and newsletters.

MacGeoPaint, which brings the treasury of Macintosh artwork to GEOS. First, transmit your MacPaint graphic by modem from the Macintosh to the Commodore. Then, MacGeoPaint converts it into geoPaint format. Mystic Jim's disks also include conversion programs for Print Shop, Newsroom, Doodle!, Koala, and run-line-encoded (RLE) graphics.

Auto Preference. This utility brings up the Set Preferences dialog box when you first start GEOS. Copy the Auto Preference file to your boot disk so that it comes before the first input driver.

GEOTab. Do you hate pressing control/I for tabs? This utility modifies the GEOS Kernal to use the left-arrow key for tabs.

GEOIcon II. Many of Mystic Jim's programs are programming tools. This disk includes an editor for creating disk, file and dialog-box icons.

Mystic Jim's disks also include a number of "hacker programs" that, for instance, create bootable work disks and change serial numbers. You will also find Basic and machine language conversion utilities.

SHAREWARE SUGGESTIONS

As useful as Mystic Jim's programs are, you can't just use them right out of the box. First of all, there's no box nor printed documentation. (If you download the software from his bulletin board, you even have to provide your own disk!) The documentation comes in a geoWrite file, which you print out before using the program. Take care! Some of the hacker programs modify your boot and work disks, so you can lose valuable data if you don't use those programs correctly.

Another important tip: always make a backup of your disks before modifying them. Use Diskcopy to duplicate your work disks and Backup to copy your boot disk files. Then, if something happens to your disk, you can copy the files back to it.

HAVING A GOOD TIME WITH GEOS

As well as all this software, Mystic Jim makes an interesting piece of hardware. Tim's Timer is a battery-powered clock/calendar. About 2 1/4 inches long, it plugs into joystick port 2 and has a pass-through plug for attaching a dongle or joystick to the other end. The circuits and battery are permanently sealed, but, according to Mystic Jim, Tim's Timer can run 20 years before the battery stops.

A disk included with Tim's Timer has utilities and documentation for using the clock/calendar. The Write.RTC program takes the time and date as set by preferences and saves it to the clock/calendar. The Read.RTC program reads the time and date and sets the GEOS clock.

An assembled and tested Tim's Timer

sells for \$42.50, including disk. If you're technically inclined and a little daring, you can purchase a do-it-yourself kit with schematics, main chip and program disk for only \$26.

FONTS AND CLIP ART

A few GEOS developers are working on fonts and clip art that will suit many users' tastes. A program called Fox Fonts One includes several attractive and useful fonts. IBM is a serifed font based on the IBM character set; another consists of Commodore graphics characters; a symbol font includes the complete Greek alphabet. Fox Fonts One sells for \$9.95 from Rabid Concepts, 1423 S. Wash Ave., Lakeland, FL 33804.

For those who may be new to GEOS, clip art is a collection of time-saving drawings that you can paste together to produce ads, newsletters or illustrations. Lamb Art and Design offers two double-sided disks full of geoPaint clip art. It includes arrows, borders, pointing fingers and other objects.

You can copy the objects you want into another geoPaint graphic or a geoWrite document. Most of the drawings overlap, so when you select one with the edit box, you might also have to copy part of another picture with it. If there is an illustration you use frequently, you can paste it into a scrapbook. The art was created by Susan Lamb, a commercial artist whose talent and 20 years of experience are reflected in the quality of her work. You'll find that her drawings will add a professional look to your work. The clip art disks sell for \$19.95 each or \$35 for the pair. GEOS-COMPATIBLE SOFTWARE

The third-party software I've discussed so far comes from small companies and independent programmers. No large commercial software devel-

oper, except for Berkeley Softworks, has produced GEOS applications, but there are a few software programs that are "GEOS-compatible."

Timeworks' Word Writer 3 is one such example, as it includes a conversion program that changes Word Writer documents into a text scrap to paste into geoWrite. The program does not, however, use any of the GEOS features—no pull-down menus or fonts. You can load the program by double clicking its icon on the GEOS 64 deskTop. (Since Word Writer 3 is a C-64 application, it is not compatible

with GEOS 128.) When you're done with it, it returns you to the GEOS deskTop.

GEOS 128 UPDATE

When I first looked at GEOS 128 in the August 1987 geoWatch, it was compatible with GEOS 64 programs that were then available (including geoWrite and geoPaint). However, GEOS 128 is *not* compatible with newer GEOS 64 programs, including geoFile and geoCalc. By now, 128 versions of most GEOS 64 programs should be available. Not only will these programs work with GEOS 128, but they should take ad-

vantage of its special features. Next month's geoWatch will discuss GEOS 128 in detail. ■

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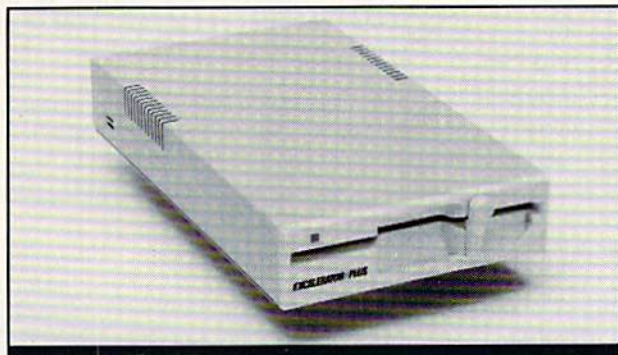

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Time-Keeper 64

Keep track of the time while
you're programming.

My Time-Keeper 64 clock-calendar continuously displays the time and the current month, day and year in the upper-right corner of your monitor as you use your computer. The program includes an autoleap-year function and a built-in alarm that can be both heard and seen (an excellent aid for the programmer who forgets to go to bed!). The clock-calendar is updated once per second and the data is stored in easily accessible RAM locations. This information can then be used in one of your own custom applications.

Time-Keeper 64 contains two listings. The first, the boot program, loads the object file and sets the date, the time and the alarm. Listing 2, Time-Keeper File Generator, creates the fast-loading object file (OB.TK 64) on your disk. When you've typed in and saved both listings, using RUN's Checksum to check your typing, run the File Generator program. When the OB.TK 64 file is written to disk, the disk error channel will report 00,OK,00,00. List the directory to make sure the new file is present.

TIME TO USE TIME-KEEPER

When you want to use Time-Keeper 64, just load and run the boot program. You'll be prompted to enter the correct time and date and whether you wish to set the alarm. Time-Keeper's display begins with an asterisk, followed by the month, day, year, hours, minutes, seconds and the characters "al," for alarm. The asterisk prevents the Basic editor from replacing or deleting a Basic program line should you press return while the cursor is at the top of the screen.

When you set the alarm, the characters "al" will appear in reverse video. When the alarm goes off, they'll flash, and the SID chip will emit a bell-like chime for about 30 seconds. You may cancel the chime by pressing shift/control C. However, the alarm will remain set for the

time you originally designated.

Though the display is continuous, you may turn it off by pressing shift/control/F and back on again with shift/control/N. I used this combination of key presses so that Time-Keeper would not conflict with other programs.

I've tested Time-Keeper 64 with 64 Notepad, Shopping List and the DOS wedge. You'll find that it works with almost any Basic program. In most instances, Time-Keeper should be the first program you load and run. One exception is 64 Notepad, which uses the same Time of Day clock. The Notepad program must be loaded and run first. Then disable the Notepad with run-stop/restore and load and run Time-Keeper 64. Finally, use the proper SYS command to restart the Notepad interrupt.

Binary Coded Decimal data (BCD) can be unpacked very easily by reading each byte as a high and low nibble (four bits). The high nibble is read by ANDing the byte with the value 240. To read the low nibble, just AND the byte with 15. To convert this information into its decimal equivalent, divide the contents of the high nibble by 16, multiply the result by 10, and then add the contents of the low nibble. You can use the following routine to read and print the time from within one of your own programs:

Now, wherever you happen to be computing, you can always know *when* you're there—to the second!

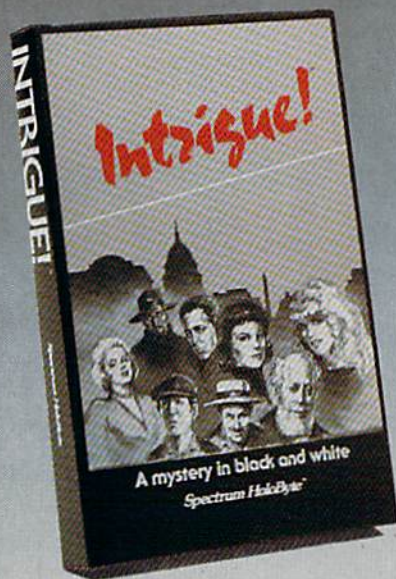

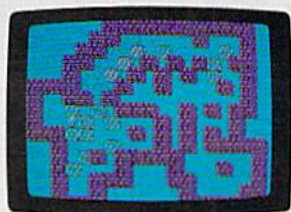

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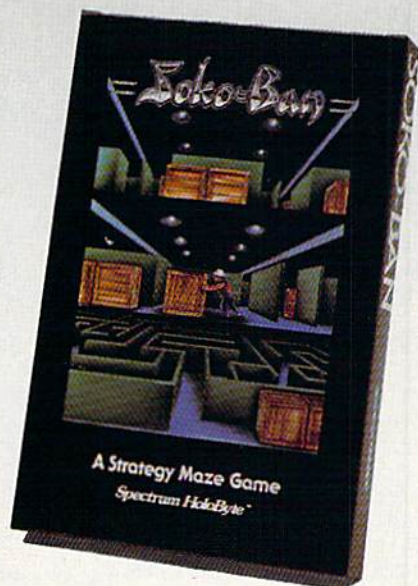

*AT commands explained, a new file compiler unveiled
and survey results revealed.*

I WAS LOOKING OVER some past columns recently when I realized that I've never given a full explanation of the AT commands I often mention when talking about the Commodore 1670 or Hayes-compatible modems. AT commands let you manipulate your modem from the Terminal mode of practically any terminal program.

AT is an abbreviation for Attention, something nearly all commands must start with. Two possible commands you can use to dial are ATDP (Attention Dial Pulse) and ATDT (Attention Dial Tone). If your local telephone system supports tone dialing, then you'll probably want to use tone because it's faster than pulse dialing. An easy way to find out if tone dialing is supported is to try sending an ATDT command. If the dial tone remains present after the number has been dialed, then your system doesn't support tone.

A phone number must follow both ATDT and ATDP. Using pulse, if you were to call my BBS, you'd enter ATDP18133775941 and return. If you're calling long-distance, or you want the modem to wait longer for a carrier, add a comma to the command at the point you want the pause to happen. For example, if you found that your local system requires a bit of a pause after the 1 and then another pause after the area code, you would enter ATDP1,813,3775941 and press return.

If you want to transmit the last command sent to the modem, enter A/ but don't press return. (This is used mostly to re-dial phone numbers.) That is one of two commands that don't require the AT prefix. The other is the + + + command. While in Terminal mode and using a 1670 modem, if you enter + + +, you'll be disconnected from whatever system you're connected with. If you're using a Hayes or compatible modem, entering + + + lets you send an AT command to the modem while you remain online.

You are also able to combine commands. Whenever I load in my terminal program and then go to Terminal mode, I enter ATE1S0=0 and press re-

turn. Table 1 gives an explanation of some other AT commands.

ONLINE GAMING

If you're a member of QLink, and you enjoy playing games, check out Rabbit Jack's Casino (see "The Online Arcade," *RUN*, September 1987). The additional disk required costs \$9.95, but it opens up a new dimension in online games. Black Jack, Poker, Bingo and the ever popular one-armed bandit are available in the casino.

Besides playing the games, you can talk to players in the casino, transfer chips to other users and ask the piano player for a song.

Rabbit Jack's Casino is a plus service, which means it costs eight cents per minute or \$4.80 for an hour.

FILE COMPILE

I've found another program that combines many files into one for up- and downloading purposes. The name of the program is Arkive V2. Written by Edward Rohr, 3063 Edgemont St., Philadelphia, PA 19134, it operates basically the same as Will Corley's Lynx (see *Telecomputing Workshop* for August 1987). If you download and see a file that ends in .ARK, you'll need Arkive V2 to dissolve it.

Arkive V2 takes up to 143 files and turns them into one program file. It handles all types of Commodore files (program, sequential, user and relative) and appears to be another good freeware program.

If you want to get a copy of Arkive V2, look on QLink or send a disk and return postage to Edward at the address above.

SATELLITE HOOKUP

I received a few letters that I plan to forward to Captain Kuster and his crew (see the *Telecomputing Workshop* column in the August 1987 issue). One note regarding satellites came from Don Pickinpaugh of Terceira, Azores, and the other came from Philip B. Shuman, PE, St. Croix, Virgin Islands. Both offer some very interesting insights and, with

luck, we'll get the Captain online in the near future.

RUN WITH US

The RUNning Board, *RUN*'s BBS (603-924-9704), is now operating with Steve Punter's BBS program, a 300/1200-baud modem and a 20-megabyte Lt. Kernal hard drive (available from Xetec Inc., 2804 Arnold Rd., Salina, KS 67401). The BBS supports messages, up- and downloading with Punter and Xmodem protocols, bulletins that you can read, and lots of other features.

If you want to send a message to the folks at *RUN*, type E at the Command prompt, enter the subject of your message, and then enter SYSOP when you're asked for the addressee of the message. When you're finished typing, press return on a blank line to exit that section and then H to see a list of the available editing commands.

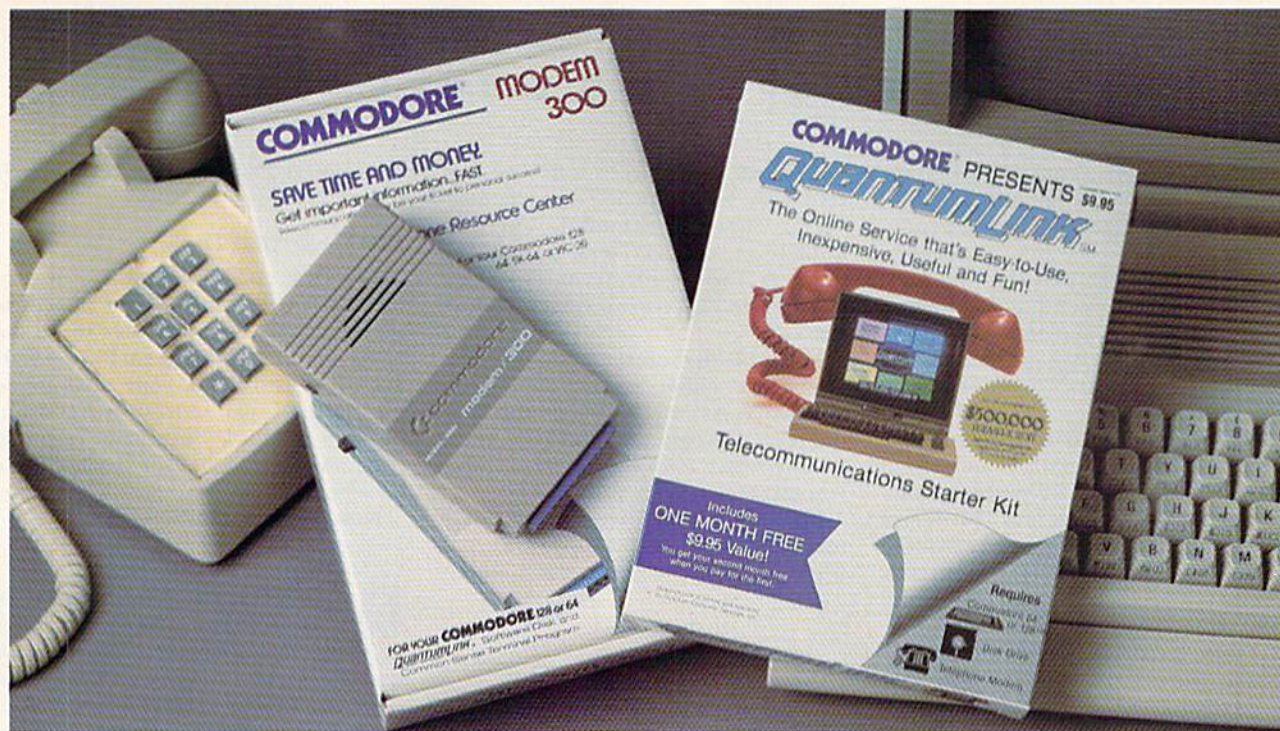
If you run into trouble, try Help, H or ?. If you're interested in getting information on Steve Punter's BBS program, call his BBS, after 6 PM EDT, at 416-896-1446. Steve's program has been around a long time and has evolved into a very reliable, comprehensive system.

SURVEY SAYS!

Here are some results of the survey I started back in June of 1987. On the computer scene, 57 percent of the users that responded have C-128s, 40 percent have 64s, two percent own Amigas and one percent own VIC-20s.

Forty-five percent of the respondents have 1670 modems, 25 percent have 1650s or compatibles, 12.5 percent own 1660s, seven percent have Volks 6480s/Aprotek 12Cs, five percent own Hayes, two and one-half percent own Avatex, two percent have TCM-1200Hs, and one percent have 1600 VicModems.

The most popular printer seems to be the Commodore MPS-801/1525 (28 percent). A close second is the MPS-801/1525 equipped with the Wilanta Arts' descender-adding, character-enhancing EPROM (27 percent). Third in popularity is the MPS-802/1526 at 20 percent, and finishing tied for fourth ▶

place are Epson, Gemini, Panasonic, Seikosha and the Commodore MPS-1200, each with five percent of the votes.

The favorite online information service is QLink at 33 percent, with local BBSs coming in second at 27 percent, CompuServe (19 percent), GENie (12 percent), PLink (five percent), and The Source and PlayNet with two percent each.

The most widely used terminal program is TouchTerm, with 14 percent of the votes, Multiterm, 12 percent, BobsTerm Pro at 10 percent, and ThirdTerm and Comterm each garnering seven percent. Common Sense, FirstTerm,

EagleTerm, and CG128 took five percent each. NezTerm, SCTerm, PhoenixTerm, Ultraterm, XmoBuf, VidTerm, MindTerm, Vidtex, Caesar's Term, Fasterm, TriTerm, GFX Term, Electronic Cottage, and QTerm all came in at two percent.

Most of the aforementioned programs are either public domain or shareware. As you can see by the large number of programs mentioned, there is no perfect terminal program; what you use depends on your needs.

Looking at hard drives, 75 percent of users who own them have the Lt. Kernal, while 12.5 percent have the Commo-

dore 9060/9090 or one of InConTrol's "Chief" series.

NOT ANOTHER ONE!

Yes, here comes yet another survey. I'd like you to send me the specifications for what you consider to be the ultimate terminal program for the C-64 and/or C-128. Send your answers to me via the usual address at RUN, but be sure to mark "Ultimate Terminal Program Specs" on the back of the envelope.

Now, on to a question. . .

Q I've read all the available articles on telecomputing and am very interested in getting online. However, I know my weaknesses, and since I'm not in a toll-free access city, I won't buy a modem and assorted accessories until I can gain access to QLink or GENie without paying long-distance charges.

I keep reading about TeleNet, Tymnet and Uninet, but have never seen a phone number or address where I could get information regarding the how to, how much, where and when of subscribing.

A QLink can be reached at 1-800-392-8200 from within the U.S. and at 1-703-883-0788 from Canada. If there is a local number for getting onto a network, they should be able to help you find it. If that doesn't work, try calling 1-800-TEL-ENET to get the nearest TeleNet number.

I can understand your reluctance to obtain a modem if you feel that you're going to be facing huge long-distance telephone bills. You might check out the local scene to see if there are any BBSs run by nearby user groups. To find these numbers, pick up a copy of The Computer Shopper, which contains quite a few pages of BBS numbers and user group listings. ■

ATE0—Makes AT commands invisible on screen as they are entered. This means "blind" typing, so type carefully.

ATE1—Displays the AT commands on the screen as they're entered. It's probably best for beginners to have the modem show you what you are typing.

ATF0—Sets the modem to half-duplex operation. You're in full duplex if you find that you can see what is coming in, but can't see what you're typing. This usually happens when you're talking directly to another user.

ATF1—Sets the modem to full-duplex operation. If you're online and find that you're getting ddoouublllee lleetttterrrs, you're in half duplex when you should be in full.

ATM0—The speaker in modem remains off during entire online period. This is appropriate for late-night telecommunications when you don't want to wake up the rest of the house (or let your mate know "you're on that computer again!").

ATM1—The speaker in modem is on during dialing, but off when a carrier is detected. This is how most people use their modems. It lets

them hear the dialing and also tells them when they've made a successful connection or reached a busy signal or wrong number.

ATM2—The speaker in modem stays on during dialing, initial connection and during the entire online session.

ATS0=?—Selects the number of rings the modem will wait before answering the phone. I usually set this to zero so that the modem won't answer the phone at all. To have the modem answer after five rings, you'd enter **ATS0=5**.

ATS7=?—Sets the length of time (in seconds) that the modem will wait for a carrier. This setting defaults to 30 seconds. If you call long-distance a lot, you could enter **ATS7=60**, instead of putting commas at the end of the dialing command.

ATV0—Displays the modem's response codes in numeric form. See Table 2 for details.

ATV1—Displays the modem's response codes as words. See Table 2 for details.

ATZ—Resets the modem. This makes the modem act as if it had just been turned on.

How good are the C-64 emulators for the Amiga? What can you do about unwanted characters on your screen?

SOFTWARE

Q Can Mike Konshak's *Datafile 3.6* be made to run on the C-128 in 128 mode? If so, what do I need to do?

A No, *Datafile 3.6* was written specifically for the C-64. However, Mike did make a C-128 version, which he markets directly. You can order *DFile 128* by calling 303-596-4243 or by writing to Michaelsoft, 4821 Harvest Court, Colorado Springs, CO 80917.

Q I'm having problems running *Presto Write 128* (RUN, June 1987). When I run the program, the screen goes blank and I can get no further. What's wrong?

A It sounds as though you're running it in 40-Column mode. *Presto Write 128* is an 80-column program that uses the C-128's 2 MHz Fast mode. Fast mode blanks the 40-column screen, and is normally used with 80-column monitors only. (Some 40-column programs will temporarily go into Fast mode in order to speed up some computational tasks, then return to the Slow mode of operation.) In general, if you're using a 40-column display and a 128 program causes the screen to go blank, it's a good bet that it only works in 80-Column mode.

Q I have a C-64, a 1541 disk drive and a 1525 printer. Thanks to *RUN*, *RUN Script* and *PrintRite*, I also have a very good-quality word processor. Does *RUN* have a spelling checker for *RUN Script*?

A We sure do. It's on *RUN's* Productivity Pak III disk. The enhanced *RUN Script* for both the C-64 and C-128 comes complete with a spelling checker and dictionary, and it can

print addresses on labels as well. The Productivity Pak III costs \$19.97, which is not bad considering it also has a spreadsheet, database, notepad and several other programs. You can order the Productivity Pak III by calling 1-800-254-5473.

Q After reading Matthew Stern's review of *Integrator 2* in the August 1987 *RUN*, I rushed right out and bought one. Imagine my displeasure to discover that I'm sitting with 2000 pieces of clip art for *Newsroom*, which I cannot use in any other program! *Integrator* only converts graphics into *Newsroom* format, not from *Newsroom* to another format! My question is, do you know of any public domain programs that can convert *Newsroom* graphics to any other format?

A Yes, I know of at least one. It's available on QuantumLink in the C-64 graphics software library and is called *PS/PM/NR V1.2*. It converts graphics back and forth between *Print Shop*, *PrintMaster* and *Newsroom*. It's also available from *RUN's* BBS, the *RUNning Board* (603-924-9704, 300/1200 baud 8N1). If you want to download it from the *RUNning Board*, you need a terminal program that supports either *Punter* or *Xmodem* protocol.

HARDWARE

Q I hope you can help me with a problem with my C-128. When the computer is in 80-Column RGB mode, small squares appear on the screen in column 27. While they don't interfere with anything, they do not look very good when I'm using the screen! This does not occur in 40-Column mode. Any ideas about what is wrong?

A It is very likely one of two things. Either you have a bad 8563 video display chip (which creates the 80-col-

umn display), or one of the two RAM chips for the 8563 (it has its own video RAM) is bad. Either way, it will require a trip to your local CBM service center. Since the RAMs are soldered to the mother board, replacing them is a job for a skilled electronic technician.

Q I currently own a C-64, but I'm planning on purchasing a PC10-2 (Commodore's MS-DOS compatible computer). Is there any emulator available that would allow me to run my 64 software on the PC10?

A No, it's not possible and is extremely unlikely ever to be so. In order for any computer to emulate the 64 (or any other computer) via software, it's necessary to translate all the 64's instructions and abilities into those of the computer emulating the 64, in this case your PC10. Since the PC10 is a relatively slow computer, the computational overhead would be so large that even if 64 programs could be made to work, they would run at one tenth or less of normal speed. Even on a high-speed computer like the Amiga, the 64 emulators available are so slow that they are essentially useless.

The only way it could be done is to have the 64 hardware (CPU, RAM, graphic and sound chips) on a board that could be inserted into the computer (like the Amiga's MS-DOS Bridge-Board). But the cost of such a board would probably be as much or more than a 64 by itself. The only practical method is that used by the 128, which is to have the 64 hardware installed as an integral part of the computer.

It has come to my attention that a fair number of 64 users are planning on upgrading to the Amiga in the belief that they will still be able to use their 64 software, using one of the commercially available Amiga C-64 emulators.

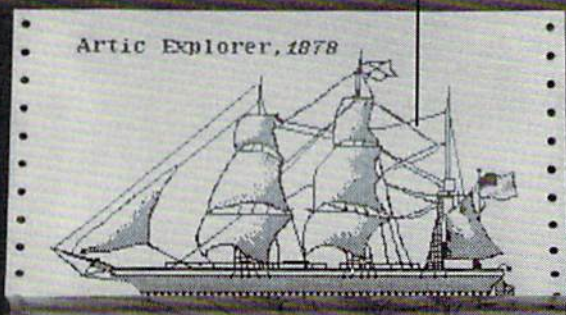
I checked with *RUN's* sister publication, *AmigaWorld*, about this, conferring with Guy Wright, *AmigaWorld's* editor-in-chief (who was at one time technical ▶

editor here at *RUN* and is still a 64 user). He was at that moment writing a review on C-64 emulators for *AmigaWorld's* February 1988 issue.

After testing both the GO 64 and C-64 Emulator programs, he came to the general conclusion that both are so slow that even the programs that will run (and most do not) are far too slow to be usable. After watching a few demonstrations, I came to exactly the same conclusion. So, better forget about using your C-64 library on the Amiga.

To be fair, however, there are two other products available that allow you to use some 64/128 hardware on an Amiga. One is the C-View cable from C-Limited. This cable will connect your Amiga 500's RGB output to a 1702 or compatible composite monitor, giving you a readable color display. Another product is Access 64, which allows you to use your 1541/1571/1581 drives as well as MPS-801 compatible printers on an Amiga, in Amiga mode. It is not an emulator, but it does have some software for transferring datafiles (like word processing files) between the Amiga and the C-64.

business, but some of their product line is still available from Electronic Arts) at one time sold both an 80-column cartridge and a word processor, PaperClip, that supported it. The program is still available from Electronic Arts, but they don't carry any Batteries Included hardware. If you need customer assistance for a Batteries Included product, call 1-415-578-0316.

Q I recently read the Basic 8 review in the November 1987 issue of *RUN*. The review mentioned it was possible to replace the 128's 16K 80-column VDC RAMs with 64K. Is it also possible to replace them with 256K chips? If so, this would allow more than one hi-res screen in memory at a time. Perhaps the computer could be drawing in one screen and displaying a second. Would that be possible?

A No, it's not possible to add 256K RAM to the 128 for 80-column display purposes. The 64K (using 120 nanosecond 4464 RAM chips) is the maximum it can be expanded to. But as for the possibility of having more than one screen in memory at a time, that is already quite possible when using Basic 8. You can have up to four monochrome screens in memory simultaneously (if you have 64K of VDC RAM), and Basic 8 is designed for drawing in one screen while looking at another (a technique called double buffering). With the 64K you can also have a large variety of different-size virtual screens, as well as variable size color displays.

By the way, while older C-128's came with only 16K of VDC RAM, the new C-128D has the full 64K video memory installed at the factory.

Q I had a VIC-20 about three years ago. During that time I bought a number of game cartridges that work only on a VIC. Now I have a C-128 and a 1571 disk drive, but I would still like to use those games! Is there any sort of hardware adapter that will let me run them on my 128? Perhaps something like the *Spartan*, which allows the C-64 to use Apple II+ software and hardware.

A No, there is no hardware emulator for the 64 or 128 that allows VIC software or cartridges to be used; and, for the same reasons given above about C-64 emulators, there is not likely to ever be one. If you want to use those

Q I have a 64C, a Blue Chip BCD disk drive and a Magnavox CM 8501 Color Monitor 40. When I use Easy Script for word processing, I only get a maximum of 40 columns of text on the screen. If I were to switch monitors to a Magnavox 80-column monitor, would the display change to 80-column format? (Easy Script does have 80-column support.)

A No. Switching to an 80-column monitor will not change your display. That's determined by the computer and its software. The C-64 uses only a 40-column text display, and changing monitors won't affect it at all. The 80-column format provided by Easy Script involves the use of scrolling the screen, but it still never displays more than 40 columns of text at a time.

There are two ways to get an 80-column display on the 64, but neither are very satisfactory solutions. One is to create a special character set using 4 x 8 pixel cells for the font, and using bit-map Graphics mode to display them. This is slower than Text mode, it's hard to read and very memory-intensive.

The other is to use an 80-column cartridge, which gives a true 80-column display. However, these are expensive and not supported by many software companies. Batteries Included (now out of

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games, the only solution is to buy a VIC-20 (there are still some around at very low prices) and use it as a game machine.

PROGRAMMING

Q I've been looking for the C-128 Programmer's Reference Guide in every bookstore in town, but no one has heard of it. Does it really exist, and can you tell me where I can order one?

A Oh yes, it certainly exists and is perhaps the single most important programming reference available for the C-128 (I usually carry one in my briefcase—honest!). It's over 700 pages long, contains a complete Basic 7 encyclopedia, sections on machine language, graphics, sprites, sound and CP/M. It also covers programming the 8563 80-column chip, a device input/output guide, memory maps and nearly 100 pages of hardware specifications.

It's published by Bantam Computer Books and retails for \$24.95. You can order a copy by calling 800-223-6834, extension 479. Its reference number is 34378-5, and they accept credit cards (VISA, MasterCard and American Express). You can also get information for ordering by mail from that number.

Q I need information about both the inner workings of the C-128's ROM routines and those of the 1571 disk drives. Does Commodore sell documented ROM listings? If so, where can I find them and how much does it cost?

A Commodore doesn't sell that information as far as I know, but you can get books with exactly that information from Abacus Software of Grand Rapids, Michigan (phone 616-241-5510). They have the *1571 Disk Drive Internals* (\$19.95) and the *C128 Basic 7.0 Internals* (\$24.95), which has extensive documentation on ROM routines. Both are excellent reference books on the in-

ner workings of the 128 Basic and the 1571 ROMS. Abacus also publishes a number of books for the 64 and 128.

Q What is the difference between the space and shifted space characters?

A The space character is a CHR\$(32), while shifted space is a CHR\$(160). They are different ASCII characters and should not be used interchangeably. For example, if you were typing in a *RUN* program listing and typed in a shifted space instead of a space, *RUN*'s Checksum program would generate an error, but the line would look correct to you, making it very difficult to debug. ■

\$46F KEEPING IT IN 64 MODE

Have you ever used C-64 software on your C-128 and noticed that pressing the reset button caused the computer to default to 64 rather than 128 mode? Chances are good that the software used a routine similar to the one below.

The 64-Mode Lock program works by setting the system vector pointing to the C-64-mode Kernal routine at address \$FF4D (65357). The added benefit of my program is that even though the C-64-mode vectors are reset, most programs will remain in memory. Consequently, other utilities can be used to un-new programs and reactivate wedges by using their appropriate SYS calls.

Wouldn't you like to gain better control of your C-64 programs? One of the best ways to get some additional control is to use a routine that pauses the execution of a program until you're ready to continue.

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While Instant Freeze 64 is a very handy utility with numerous applications, it does, unfortunately, disable run-stop/restore. So, when you need run-stop/restore, enter SYS 2048.

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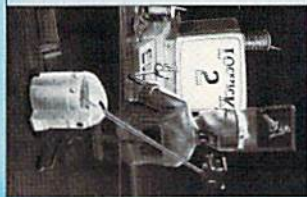
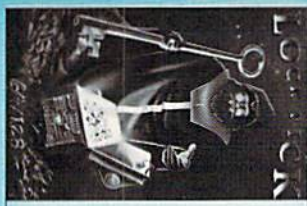

\$472 UNDERLINE 64 CURSOR

Most C-128 users know they have an underline cursor in 80-Column mode by pressing the ESC/U key combination. Not wanting the C-64 to suffer the indignity of lacking an underline-cursor option, I wrote Underline 64 Cursor. Type it in, save it, then run it. Your C-64's big, blocky cursor is quickly replaced with an underline cursor.

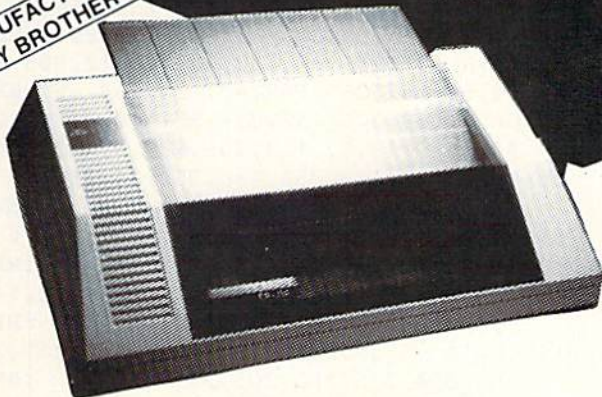
My underline cursor looks similar to the C-128's, but it works differently. Because the C-64's default cursor is actually a reversed image of the character beneath it, my program eliminates reversed characters and replaces them with underlined characters.

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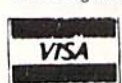

\$473 CURING 1581 WOES

Some software, such as Fontmaster 128, fully supports Commodore's 3 1/2-inch 1581 disk drive, but most commercial C-128 software was written before the 1581 appeared. To use the 1581 with your C-128 software, set your 1581 to device 8 and your 1571 to device 9, using their respective DIP switches. (Don't attempt this with the C-128D's 1571—it comes without DIP switches. *See, Commodore!*)

Next, place your autoboot C-128 program disk in the 1571 and enter: SYS 65363,0,9,0. Your program will autoboot and communicate with the 1581, considered device 8 by the computer. True autobooting requires the auto-boot 128 utility that comes with the 1581. Use it to install an auto-boot to a file called Device 9 Boot on a formatted 3 1/2-inch disk.

Now type in:

Save it to your auto-boot 1581 with the name DEVICE 9 BOOT. Put your program disk in the 1571 and reset the C-128, and your program will boot from the 1571. Incidentally, if you need to copy spreadsheet, database and word processing files to the 1581, try the Uni-Copy program included with the 1581. It copies VizaStar worksheet files, among others.

\$474 SCROLL CONTROL

Finally—a short routine that demonstrates a technique to prevent data from scrolling out of sight before you've read it. You'll find this routine is both easy to implement in any programs of your own design and works with the C-64 and with the C-128 in 40- and 80-Column modes.

When the routine is activated, tap the space bar to pause the output, and press it again to resume scrolling. To exit the program, press Q.

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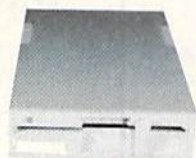

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MEGA-MAGIC

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BLANK-IT! 128

Last month's Mega-Magic featured Blank-it! 64, a utility that prevented screen burn from permanently ruining the display screen. For those readers who missed the January column, screen burn is a condition that results from a monitor screen being left on too long without a change in the display.

This column presents Gerald Elliot's 128 version of Blank-it!, which prevents screen burn on the C-128's 80-column screen. If no key press is made within ten minutes, the 80-column screen automatically blanks itself. Once the screen is blanked, pressing any key restores the screen to its original display.

To use Blank-it! 128, type in Listing 1, using RUN's Checksum program, and save it to disk before running it. It erases itself after you run it, so you must save the program before executing it. Also have a work disk in the drive, because the program writes a one-block machine language file to disk called Blank-it! 128 as soon as you run it.

Whenever you want to access the ML file, use the Boot command if you're using a 1571 disk drive, or the Bload command if you're using a 1541 or clone to boot it. Use this syntax for a 1571 boot:

BOOT"BLANK-IT 128" <return> ►



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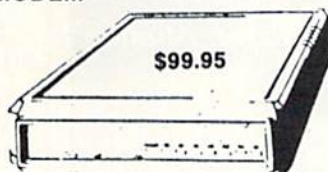
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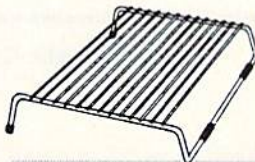


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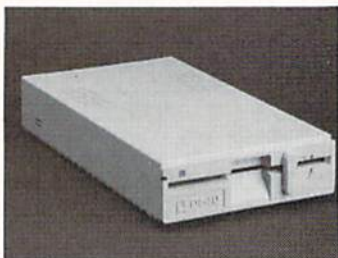

The 1541 Bload command requires a little more typing:
BLOAD "BLANK-IT 128",B0,P3584 <return>

Then enter SYS 3584 to activate it.

When you're ready to disable the program, press run-stop/restore. Entering SYS 3584 will re-activate the program. The program is interrupt-driven and resides in memory locations 3584 to 3798. Programmers will find the program easily relocatable.

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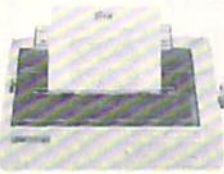


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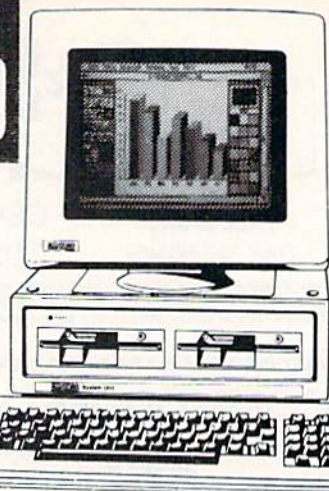


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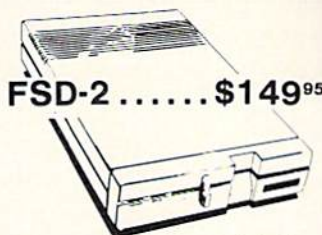
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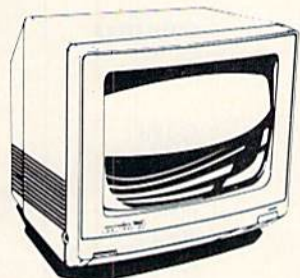


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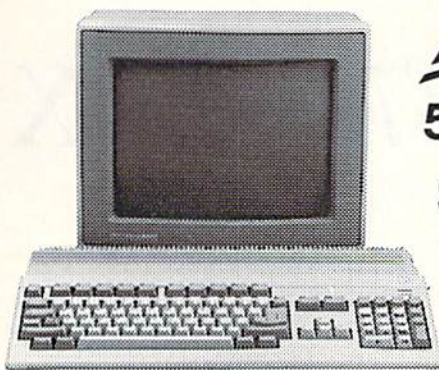
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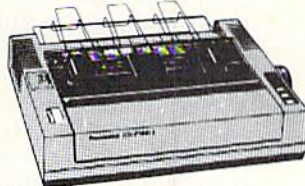
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RUN'S CHECKSUM

By BOB KODADEK

TYPE IN *RUN'S CHECKSUM*, which serves for both the C-64 and for the C-128 in either 40- or 80-Column mode, and save it to disk before running. When typing in a program from *RUN*, first load and run *RUN'S Checksum*. The screen will display the 64 or 128 version, whichever is appropriate, and a SYS number that deactivates the Checksum when typed in and followed by return. Always disable *RUN'S Checksum* before attempting to run another program. The same SYS number will reactivate the Checksum.

Keep the following in mind: You can abbreviate Basic keywords; spaces affect the checksum only when within quotes; and the order of characters affects the checksum.

When you press return after typing in a program line, a one-, two-, or three-digit number from 0 to 255 appears directly below the line just entered. If this number matches the checksum value in the program listing, the line is correct. You enter the next line by typing it in right over the previous line's checksum value. If the number that appears *doesn't* match the listing's checksum value, carefully compare the line with the magazine listing to find your error. Then move the cursor back up to the line and make your corrections. Now, after you press return, the correct checksum value should appear. Continue entering the listing in this way until all the lines have been correctly typed. Then deactivate *RUN'S Checksum*, using the SYS number. Save the finished program.

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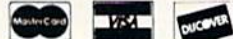
